

On this day came on to be considered the returns of an election held on the 17th day of December, 1910, in Common School District No. 1, of this County, upon the question of issuing \$15,000. of schoolhouse bonds for said district, running 40 years, and bearing 5% percent interest, and levying a tax on all taxable property of said district sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity, and it appearing that said election was in all respects legally held and that said returns were duly and legally made and that there were cast at said election 45 votes, of which number there were cast For the Bonds 44 votes

Against the Bonds 1 vote

And it appearing to the Court from said returns that a majority of the qualified property tax paying voters of said district, voting at said election voted in favor of issuing said bonds and for said tax, The Court does hereby declare the said tax to have carried in said district and the proposition for the issuance of said bonds to have been adopted and that this Court is authorized to issue said

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bonds and to levy and have assessed and collected said tax.

It is ordered by the court that Geo. Murphy be appointed Justice of the Peace for Precinct No. 5.

It is ordered by the court that W. J. Davis be appointed constable for Precinct Nos.

It is ordered by the court that the final settlement of the County Treasurer N. H. Pratt be approved after being sworn to by him.

It is ordered by the court that D. C. Rains be allowed \$4. for hauling bridge bank sills.

It is ordered by the court that R. C. Travis be allowed \$4.00 for hauling lumber.

It is ordered by the court that Cooper Lbr. Co. be allowed \$31.89 for Bridge lumber.

It is ordered by the court that The McElroy Lbr. Co. be allowed \$52.20 for lumber.

It is ordered by the court that J. E. Willis be allowed \$3.75 for nails.

It is ordered by the court that J. S. Walker be allowed .50 for hauling bridge sill.

It is ordered by the court that Fred Berryman be allowed \$5.00 for repairing one bridge.

It is ordered by the court that W. A. Ruffin be allowed \$2.50 for grading road.

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It is ordered by the court that J. A. Deulock be allowed 49⁰⁰ for bridge work.

It is ordered by the court that the Co. Judge purchase 2 Volumes White's Penal Code.

It is ordered by the court that the Sheriff be authorized to have all pipes and water connections in jail be put in working condition, and that the window sash be placed back in window.

We the undersigned, being a majority of the qualified property tax paying voters of Common School District No. 33 in Sabine County, Texas, desiring to tax ourselves for the purpose of supplementing the State School fund apportioned to said District, hereby make application to the County Judge of Sabine County, Texas, for an order for an election to be held in said Common School District No. 33, in Sabine County, to determine whether or not a tax of and at the rate of 30 cents on the \$100 valuation of taxable property in said district shall be levied for the said purpose. The State of Texas } Whereas on the 31st day of December
County of Sabine } 1910, a petition was presented to me
for an election in Common school District No. 33
of this County, on the question of authorizing a tax
of and at the rate of 30 cents on the \$100 valuation

of taxable property in said district for the purpose of supplementing the state school fund appropriated to said district said petition bearing the requisite number of signatures of the property taxpaying voters of said district, and being in every respect in conformity with law.

Now, therefore, I, J. R. Smith, in my capacity as County Judge of Sabine County, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held on the 28th of January, 1911, at School House in said Common District No. 33, of this County as established by the order of the Commissioners Court of this County of date the 25th day of July 1910, which is recorded in Book "36" pages one, of the minutes of said Court, to determine whether a majority of the legally qualified property taxpaying voters of that district desire to tax themselves for the purpose of supplementing the state school fund apportioned to said district and to determine whether the Commissioners Court of this County shall be authorized to levy, assess and collect annually a tax of and at the rate of 30 cents on the \$100 valuation of taxable property in said district for said purpose.

J. E. Wood is hereby appointed presiding officer of said election, and shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same, he shall, within five days after said election has been held make due return thereof to the Commissioners Court of this County as is required by law for holding a General election.

The ballots for said election shall have written or printed thereon the following:

"For School Tax"
"Against School Tax"

All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and of this County and who are resident property taxpayers in said district shall be entitled to vote at said election.

The Sheriff of this County shall give notice of said election by posting three notices at three public places in said district.
