On this day came out to be considered the returns of an election held on the 28th day of January, 1911, in Common School District No. 33, of this County upon the question of determining whether or not a special tax of 30 cents on the \$100 valuation of all taxable property in said District shall be levied and collected for school purposes, and it appearing that said election was in all respects legally held and that said returns were duly and legally made and that there were cast at said election 6 votes of which number there were cast, For School Tax 6 votes.

And it appearing to the court from said returns that a majority of the qualified property taxpaying voters of said district voting at said election voted in favor of levying said tax the court does hereby declare the said tax to have carried in said district, and that this court is authorized to levy said tax and have assessed and collected the same.
