

The State of Texas, on the 20th day of June, 1911, a County of Sabine petition was presented to me for an election of authorizing a tax of and at the rate of 25 cents on the \$100, valuation of taxable property in said district for the purpose of supplementing the State School Fund. The petition bearing the requisite number of signatures of property taxpayers within the district and being in conformity with law.

Now, therefore, I, J. M. Smith, in my capacity as County Judge of Sabine County, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held on the 17th day of August, 1911, at School House in said Common School District No. 2 of this County as authorized by order of the Commissioners of this County of date May Term, 1911, which is of record in Book 61, of the Minutes of said County to determine whether a majority of the legally qualified property taxpayers voters of that district desire to tax taxable property for the purpose of supplementing the State School Fund. The said district and to determine whether the Commissioners of this County shall authorize to levy taxes and collect annually a tax of and at the rate of 25 cents on the \$100, valuation of taxable property in said district for said purpose.

H. M. Campbell is hereby appointed presiding officer for said election, and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same and he shall make the same five days after said election has been held, make the return thereof to the Commissioners of this County as is required by law for holding a general election.

The voters for said election shall have written or printed thereon the following:

"For School Tax"
 "Against School Tax"

All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and of this County and who are resident property taxpayers in said district shall be entitled to vote in said election.

The integrity of this County shall give notice of said election by posting these notices on other public places.
