THE STATE OF TEXAS } Whereas, on the 11th day of December, 1911, a petition was presented to
COUNTY OF SABINE } me for an election in Common School District No. 9 of this County on
the question of authorizing an increase of tax of and at the rate of 20 cents on the \$100
valuation of taxable property in said district for the purpose of supplementing the State
School fund apportioned to said district, said petition bearing the requisite number of
signatures of property tax paying voters of said district, and being in every respect in con-
formity with law: Now therefore, I, T.R. Smith, in my capacity as County Judge of Sabine County,
Texas, do hereby order that an election be held on the 20th day of January, 1912 at Friendship
Church house in said Common School District No. 9, of this County as established by order of
the Commissioners' Court of said county of date 7th day of September, 1911 which is recorded
in Book "K" of the Minutes of said Court, to determine whether a majority of the legally
qualified property taxpaying voters of that district desire to increase the tax 20 cents
on the \$100 valuation upon themselves for the purpose of supplementing the State School fund
apportioned to said district, and to determine whether the Commissioners' Court of this County
shall be authorized to levy, assess and collect annually a tax of and at the rate of 40 cents
on the \$100 valuation of taxable property in said district for said purposes.

J. A. Clark is hereby appointed presiding officer for said election, and he shall select two
judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same, and he shall, within five days after
said election has been held, make due return thereof to the Commissioners' Court of this
County as is required by law for holding a general election.

The ballots for said election shall have written or printed thereon the following:

"For increase of School Tax."
"Against increase of School Tax."

All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and of this County and who
are resident property tax payers in said district shall be entitled to vote at said election.
