

On this day came on to be considered the returns of an election held on the 6th day of January, 1912, in Common School District No. 32 of this county upon the question

of issuing \$1300 of schoolhouse bonds for said district, running ten years, and bearing 5 per cent interest, and levying a tax on all taxable property of said district sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity, and it appearing that said election was in all respects legally held and that said returns were duly and legally made and that there were cast at said election 53 votes, of which number there were cast:—"For the Bonds" 26 votes. "Against the Bonds" 27 votes.

And it appearing to the court from said returns that a majority of the qualified property taxpaying voters of said district, voting at said election, voted against the issuing of said bonds and for said tax, the court does hereby declare the said tax failed to carry in said district and the proposition for the issuance of said bonds to have been defeated, and that this court unauthorized to issue said bonds.

It is ordered by the court that the Clerk credit the Finance Ledger with \$25.96, balancing same, the same being the amount shown by the report of the Finance Committee to be due by W. T. Arnold, Sr., on penalty collected during the month of July, 1908. Said report showing that same has been fully paid, and that the receipts are properly attached to said report.

It is ordered by the court that the Clerk issue to the members of the court their per diem for one day's service.

It is ordered that the court stand adjourned until the next regular term.
