There being no further business the Board of Equalization adjourned this July  
1st. 1914.

The Commissioners Court met in called session this July 1st. 1914 with all  
members presents and the following matters together with others were had to wit:-

Accounts were allowed as per accounts allowed Ledger.

The Committee of Three appointed by the County Judge to examine the Mule of  
M.L. Whitehead made their report that they believed that the mule was affected with  
Farcy and recommended that the Mule be killed and that the ~~condemned~~ animal  
was valued at \$50.00. The Court instructed the Clerk to issue warrants to each  
of the Committee for \$3.00 for their services.

M.L. Whitehead made a claim of \$75.00 for the Value of a Mule condemned by  
a Committee and the Court refused to allow anything for the Mule.

The returns of an election held in Common School Dist. No. 33 came on to be  
considered and it was found that the increase of Tax from .25 cents to .40 cents  
on the \$100.00 valuation carried and the Court ordered that said Tax be levied,  
assessed and collected.

The Court allowed Mrs. Nellie Low \$10.00 as County Pension and instructed  
the Clerk to issue County Warrant to her for that amount out of General Co. Fund.

The Court was opened by proclamation of the Sheriff.

The following matters together with others were had to wit:-

Accounts were allowed as per the accounts allowed Ledger.

The Court allowed J.B. Lewis \$3.50 for stamps.

The Court allowed F.P.Adams \$5.00 for stamps for mailing our Notices.

Court ordered that T.E.Alford and J.J. Hankla be appointed as election managers of the Geneva Voting Precinct, at Geneva, Texas.

The Court ordered the Clerk to issue a Warrant to Geo. Oliver for County Pension for the sum of \$15.00.

The following petition was read to the Court and the election was ordered to be held on the 29th. day of July 1914.

To the Hon. J.B.Lewis, County Judge and Ex. Officio Supt. Public Instructions Sabine County, Texas:-

We your petitioners being resident citizens and owners of real estate, residing in Temple School Dist. No. 35, Public Free School No. 35 in Sabine County, Texas, ask your Hon. to order an election to determine whether or not said school shall levy and collect a special Tax of .30 Thirty cents on the \$100. One Hundred Dollar valuation of said School Dist. for School purposes for the year 1914 and for each year thereafter. To appoint managers to hold said election and to do all other and necessary things in said cause to make said election legal, For which we will ever pray:

V.H.Vickers, W.H.Busby, L.P.McFarland, M.F.Carter, J.H.Gooch and E.H.Robbins.

Court ordered the clerk to issue each officer his per diem.

There being no further business the Court adjourned, to meet at the next regular meeting.

WHEREAS, on the 1st day of June 1914, a petition was presented to me for an election in Common School District No. 35 of this County on the question of authorizing a tax of and at the rate of (1) 30 cents on the \$100 valuation of taxable property in said district for the purpose supplementing the State School Fund apportioned to said district, said petition bearing the requisite number of signatures of property taxpaying voters of said district, and being in every respect in conformity with law;

NOW THEREFORE, I, J.B. Lewis in my capacity as County Judge of Sabine County, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held on the 29th day of July 1914, at (2) the Post Office known as Bayou in said Common School District No. 35 of this County as established by order of the Commissioners Court of this County of date the 11th day of May 1914, which is recorded in Book L, pages 137 of the minutes of said Court (3) to determine whether a majority of the legally qualified property taxpaying voters of that district, desire to tax themselves for the purpose of supplementing the State School

Fund apportioned to said district and to determine whether the Commissioners Court of this County shall be authorized to levy, assess and collect annually a tax of and at the rate of (1) Thirty cents on the \$100 valuation of taxable property in said district for said purpose.

V. H. Vickers is hereby appointed presiding officer for said election, and he shall select two Judges and two Clerks to assist him in holding the same, and he shall, within five days after said election has been held, make due return thereof to the Commissioners Court of this County, as is required by law for holding a general election.

The ballots for said election shall have written or printed thereon the following:

"For School Tax."

"Against School Tax."

All persons who are legally voters of this State and of this County and who are resident property taxpayers in said district shall be entitled to vote at said election.

The Sheriff of this County shall give notice of said election by posting three notices at three public places in the said district for three weeks before the election.
