

Commissioners Court met in regular monthly meeting January the 11th. 1915 with the following members present:

J.B. Lewis, County Judge, Geo. W. Herren, Com. Prec. No. 1, J.A. Hyden, Com. Precinct No. 2, L.T. Halbert, Com. Prec. No. 3, and C.M. Bennett, Com. Prec. No. 4, Jas. G. Barker, Sheriff and F.P. Adams, Clerk.

The Court was opened by proclamation of the sheriff.

The following matters together with others were had to wit:-

Accounts were allowed as per minutes of Accounts Allowed Ledger.

Court allowed Jas. G. Barker \$4.00 for Cade Lunaoy case, Herren, Hyden and Bennett voting for the allowance and Halbert voting against it.

The monthly report of Jas. G. Barker, Tax Collector was approved by the Court.

The Bond of L. Ware, J.P., and Notary Public for Precinct No. 3 was approved by the Court.

The Court allowed M.L. Whitehead \$50.00 for a Mule that was condemned by a Commission in 1914 on account of having the Pharyx.

The following petition signed by S.D. Solly and eight others was granted:-

We your petitioners and road hands on the Bronson road respectfully petition your body to change said road from the course it is now running and that you cause it to run by the way of Tram Track and from C.H. Easleys house to the Brookland road.

The following petition signed by D.W. Dainwood and others was granted:-

We the undersigned citizens of Precinct No. 2 respectfully request that the said Court grant the change of a short place of the Public road beginning in front of W.L. McDaniels then down the land-line between W.L. Cooper and W.L. McDaniel intersecting the said Public Road in front of the Fairdale School building.

Upon a petition signed by C.E. Casey and others asking the Court to appoint I.H. Courtney Constable of Precinct No. 6, the same was granted and I.H. Courtney appointed to the office of Constable.

Upon order the Clerk was instructed to issue duplicate Warrant our Road and Bridge fund to Clyde Vickers for the amount of \$14.60.

The Court voted to retain J.S. Goodrich as Auditor for such days as he will work at the rate of \$3.00 per day, Herren, Halbert and Bennett voting for the order and Hyden voting against it.

The Court ordered the Clerk to issue each officer his per diem.

The Court adjourned to meet at the next regular term.
