

The Commissioners Court met in Special Called session Monday morning November the 29th 1915 with the following members present:

- J. B. Lewis County Judge.
- Geo. W. Nerren, Com. Beat No. 1.
- J. A. Hyden, Com. Beat No. 2.
- L. T. Halbert Com. Beat No. 3.
- C. H. Bennett Com. Beat No. 4, F. P. Adams, Clerk and J. G. Barker Sheriff.

The Court was opened by proclamation of the Sheriff.

Accounts were allowed as per accounts Allowed Ledger.

The Court having heretofore passed an order awarding to J.L. Arlitt, of Austin, Texas Agent of Terry, Slayden and Briggs of Toledo, Ohio, \$17000.00 R. & B. Funding Warrants and the said J.L. Arlitt agent for Terry, Slayden and Briggs having failed to comply with the agreement in connection with said Warrants, the action of the Court in awarding said warrants is hereby rescinded.

The returns of a special school tax election held in Common School Dist. No. 17 came on to be counted the result was declared as follows-

For Increase of School Tax-----26 votes.

Against Increase of School Tax-----9 votes.

It is therefore ordered by the Court that a tax of and at the rate of .50 cents on the \$100.00 valuation be levied, assessed and collected in said School District No. 17.

Upon return of Special School Tax Election held in Common School District No. 12 of Sabine County, Texas, for increase of School Tax came on to be considered and the following result found-

For increase of School Tax-----11 votes.

Against Increase of School Tax-----10 votes.

It is therefore ordered by the Court that a tax of and at the rate of .50 cents on the \$100.00 valuation on all taxable property in said School District No. 12 be levied, assessed and collected.

Upon the return of special School Tax Election held in Common School District No. 29 for increase of School tax the following result was found-

For increase of school tax-----7 votes.

Against increase of school tax-----7 votes.

It appearing to the Court that there was no majority in said election it is ordered that no increase of tax be levied, assessed and collected.

The Court took up the matter of refunding the R and B fund of the County for the amount of \$17000.00 and Austin Brothers of Dallas, Texas, agreed to take up the contract at a discount of 5% on the warrants and carry the amount at the rate of 6% interest. It is therefore the order of the Court that they be granted the contract and that their man meet the Court at the Regular December meeting with the orders prepared and the warrants made up at which time the matter would be closed.

The Court ordered that the County Judge have a notice published in the County papers to the effect that all holders of Road and Bridge script leave it at the First National Bank of Hemphill, Texas, for collection.

The Court ordered the Clerk to issue each officer his per diem.

There being no further business the Court adjourned to meet at the next regular meeting.
