County of Sabine Whereas, On the 4th day of April 1916, a petition was presented to me for an election in Common School District No 12 of this county on the question of authorizing an increase of the local school tax in said common school district from 20 cents on the one hundred dollars valuation of taxable property in said school district to 50 on the one hundred dollars valuation of taxable property in said school district for the purpose of supplementing the State School Funds apportioned to said district said petition bearing the requisite number of signatures of property taxpaying voters in said district and being in every respect in conformity with law.

NOW, THEREFORE I, J.B. Lewis, in my capacity as county judge of said county, do hereby order that an election be held on the 15 day of July 1916 at the school house in said district as established by order of the commissioners court of said county of date, the 12th day of July 1915 with order in recorded in Book L page 216-17 of the minutes of said commissioners court. to determine whether or not the school tax in said district shall be increased from 20 cents on the one hundred dollars valuation of taxable property in said school district to 50 cents on the one hundred dollars valuation of taxable property in said school district and to determine whether or not a majority of the legally qualified property taxpaying voters in said school district desire said increase in said school tax for the purpose of supplementing the State School Fund apportioned to said district and to determine whether or not the commissioners court of sabine county, shall be authorized to assess levy and collect annually a tax of and at the rate of 50 cents on the one hundred dollars valuation of taxable property in said district for said purpose. J. Games is hereby appointed presiding officer of said election and he shall have the right to select two judges and clerks to assist him in holding said election and he shall within five days after said election make due return thereof to the commissioners court of this County as is required by law for holding general elections. The ballots for said election shall have written or printed thereon the words.

All persons who are legally qualified property tax paying voters residing in said school district shall be allowed to vote at said election. The sheriff of this County shall give notice of said election by posting three notices at three public places within said school for three full weeks before said election.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, J.B. Lewis, in my capacity as county judge of said County, do hereby

order that an election be held on the 8th day of July, 1916, AT THE SCHOOL HOUSE IN SAID school district as established by order of the commissioners court of said county of date the 12 day of July 1915 which order is recorded in Book L page 216-17 of the minutes of said commissioners Court. to determine or nor the school tax in said district shall be increased fro 20 cents on the on ehundred dollars valuation of axable property in said school district to 50 cents on the one hundred dollars valuation of taxable property in said school district, and to determine whether or not a majority of the legally qualified property taxpaying voters in said school district desire said increase in said school tax for the purpose of suppling the State School Fund apportioned to said district and to determine whether or not the commissioners court of Sabine County, Texas, shall be authorized to assess levy and collect annually a tax of and at the rate of 50 cents on the one hundred dollars valuation of taxable property in said district for said purposes. A.J. Bennett is hereby appointed presiding officer of said election and he shall have the right to select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding said election and he shall within five days after said election made due returns thereof to the commissioners court of this County as is required by law for holding general elections. The ballots for said election shall have writtned or printed thereon the words.

County of Sabine | A special election having been held in the town of Bronson, Sabine County, Texas, on the 30th day of October, 1915, within the following boundaries: Beginning at the west end of McHenry street 175 feet west of Sandy Creek, Thence in an easterly direction with McHenry Street to its eastern end and intersection with Diamond Avenue; Thence in a northerly direction with Diamond Avenue to its northern end and intersection with Gambatti Street; Thence Thence in a westerly direction with Gambattie Street to its western end and intersectipn with Johnson Avenue; Thence southerly with Johnson Avenue to its southern end and place of beginning to determine whether or not said town should be incorporated within said above described boundaries, and a mojority of the qualified voters residing in said town of Bronson within said above described boundaries, having declared at said election in favor of the incorporation of said town within said boundaries and the Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas, at its regular session on the 8th day of November 1915, having declared the results of said election in favor of incorporation and the County Judge of said County having on the 9th day of November 1915 declared said town of Bronson Sabine County, Texas, to be incorporated within the above described boundaries.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, J.B. Lewis County Judge of said county hereby order and direct that an election be held on the 18th day of December 1915 in said town of Bronson Sabine county, Texas, within the above described boundaries for the purposes of electing a Mayor A city Marshall and five Aldermen for said town said election to be held as the law in such cases directs. C.E. Casey is hereby appointed presiding officer of said election.

Every male person who has attained the age of twenty one years and who has resided in said town of Bronson and within the above described boundaries for the six months next

preceding the date for this election and who is qualified voter under the constitution and laws of the State of Texas shall be allowed to vote at said election.

The Polls shall be opened and closed and the election conducted as prescribed by law for the holding of general elections.
