


This 16th day of August, 1916.

The commissioners court met in special session, with J.B. Lewis, County Judge and L.T. Halbert, J.A. Hyden, and C.M. Bennett, commissioners, present, for the purpose of canvassing and considering the returns of a special election held in Sabine county, Texas, on the 5th day of August, 1916, to determine whether or not the sale of intoxicating liquors should be prohibited within Sabine county, Texas. After canvassing and considering the returns of said election, the court passed the following order, to-wit:

Whereas, on the 16th day of August, 1916, the commissioners court of Sabine county Texas, being in special called session at the court house in the town of Hemphill, Sabine County, Texas, with J.B. Lewis, County Judge, and L.T. Halbert, J.A. Hyden and C.M. Bennett, commissioners, present, the returns of a special election held in Sabine county Texas, on the 5th day of August, 1916, to determine whether or not the sale of intoxicating liquors should be prohibited in Sabine county, Texas, came on to be considered by the court, and it appearing to the court that at said election there were 1150 cast and that at said election there were 938 votes cast in favor of prohibition, and 212 votes cast against prohibition, it is declared by the court that a majority of the votes cast at said election were cast in favor of prohibition; and it is further ordered and decreed by the court that the sale of intoxicating liquors shall be, and the same is hereby absolutely prohibited within Sabine County, Texas, except as may be permitted by law.

It was ordered by the Court that a copy of this order be published for four successive weeks in some newspaper in Sabine County, said newspaper to be selected by the County judge for that purpose.

All persons who are legally qualified voters in this State and County and who are resident property taxpayers in said school district shall be entitled to vote at said election.

A.J. Crouch is hereby appointed presiding officer of said election and he shall be entitled to select two clerks and two judges to assist him in holding same.

Said election was ordered by the County Judge of this County by order made on the 11th day of July A .D. 1916 and this notice is given in pursuance of said order.
