The Court ordered that the Bronson and Geneva Road that runs through M. S. Parrieh "farm he changed from a third; to a second class Road and M. S. Parrish is ordered to remove all gates off of said Road.

Count allowed Geo. Oliver \$10.00 for County Pension.

The Court approved the Delinquent Tax Report of C. B. Bright Tax Collector.

The Court ordered the Clerk to leave each officer his per diem. There being no further business the Court adjourned until next regular meeting.
