

The Commissioners Court Met in regular Monthly Meeting, Sept. 10th, 1917, with all members present.

The Court was opened by proclamation of the Sheriff.

The Court ordered that the Trustees of Blue Springs School Dist. #35, be allowed to sell the old School building known as Temple School House located about one-half mile of J. H. Gooches farm and the proceeds of said sale be used in building and equipping the School building in Blue Springs School Dist. #35.

Accounts were allowed as per accounts allowed Ledger.

The Court allowed B. F. Chambers \$5.00 on the Account filed.

The Court allowed T. T. Sparks \$5.00 and Mrs. Nannie Meador \$10.00 as County Help.

The Court ordered that L. N. Jordan be exempted from Public Road duty for 12 Months.

The Court ordered that the Ruddell School Dist. #17 be allowed to use all the special Tax for 1917 for maintenance purposes.

It is ordered by the Court that the County Attorney, T. B. Hamilton is hereby Granted the consent of said Court in accordance with act. 347 (2811) (245a) Gen. Provisions to appoint an assistant County Attorney to attend the duties of his Office during his endorsed absence while attending the Officers Training Camp at Camp Rinston, (San Antonio, Texas) and to continue in Office during the pleasure of the said T. B. Hamilton as provided in said above mentioned article.

The Court ordered that the Milam and Shelbyville Public Road be changed wheresaid Road leaves A. A. Wilsons fence and to follow said fence on old Road to corner of said fence and then in an eastern direction back to Milam & Isla Road.

The Court ordered that Public Road Running by N. A. Whites and T. J. Jacks places be changed so as to Wm. by A. D. Bennett's house to intersect the Homer Road at B. K. Jacks old Road.

The Court ordered the Clerk to issue each Officer his per diem.

The Court recessed until Wednesday Sept. 12, 1917.
