

Election Notice

The State of Texas,
County of Sabine.

On this the 12th day of November, 1917, the Commissioner's Court of Sabine County, Texas, being in regular session, at a regular term of said Court, all the members of said Court, to-wit:

being present, and passed the following order:

WHEREAS, on the petition of T. S. McDaniel and one hundred and fifty-one other persons filed their petition in this Court, praying that Bonds be issued by Sabine County Texas, in the sum of Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) Dollars, for the purpose hereinafter stated

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners' Court of said County that an election be held on the 15th day of December, 1917, at which election the following propositions shall be submitted:

Shall the Commissioners' Court of the County of Sabine be authorized to issue Bonds of said County in the sum of Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) Dollars, payable serially, not to exceed thirty years from their date, bearing interest at the rate of not to exceed five and one-half per cent, interest payable semi-annually, and to levy a tax sufficient to pay the interest on said Bonds and create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem them at maturity, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining or operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof.

Said election shall be held at the several voting precincts in said County, and the following named persons are hereby appointed managers of said election:

Said election shall be held under and by virtue of an Act of the First Called Session of the 31st Legislature 1909, and being Chapter Two of Title 16, of the Revised Civil Statutes, and as amended by the regular session of the 35th Legislature, which convened January 9th, 1917, and only qualified voters, who are property tax payers of said County, shall be allowed to vote, and all voters desiring to support the proposition to issue bonds shall have printed on their ballots the words "For the issuance of Bonds" and those opposed shall have printed on their ballots the words "Against the issuance of Bonds". And all voters desiring to support a tax to be levied upon the property of said County shall have printed on their ballots the words "For the levying of a tax in payment therefor" and those opposed shall have printed on their ballots the words "Against the levying of a tax in payment therefor". The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the laws of the State governing general elections.

A copy of this Order, signed by the County Judge of said County, shall serve as proper notice of said election, and the County Judge is directed to cause said notice to be posted up at the places designated for holding said election, at least thirty days prior to the date of said election.
