The Commissioners Court met in regular monthly meeting March the 11th 1918 with all members present.

The Court was opened by proclamation of the Sheriff and the following matters were had together with others-

Accounts were allowed as per Accounts Allowed Ledger.

The Court ordered that the County Judge be authorized to purchase for the County a needle and outfit for inoculating hogs that are diseased with Cholera to be used by the Agriculture Demonstration Agent.

The Court ordered the Clerk to issue to E. L. Bardwell the sum of \$125.00 the amount due him for painting the Courthouse and Jail Roofs.

The Court voted to raise the County Clerks salary to \$600.00 per annum as an ex-officio salary.

The Court designated the Hemphill Streets and the Courthouse yard as public working places so that Convicts might be worked upon them.

Mr. Lamar Acker met with the Court and the matter of entering into contract with him was gone into and he and the County Judge agreed to prepare a written contract which would be presented at the next regular meeting.

There being no further business the Court adjourned after having ordered the Clerk to issue each officer his per diem.
