

Commissioners Court met in regular monthly meeting July the 8th, 1918 with the following members present:

W. R. Cousins, County Judge.

D. A. Easley, Com. Beat No. 1.

J. A. Hyden, Com. Beat No. 2.

J. B. Hargroves, Com. Beat No. 3.

C. M. Bennett, Com. Beat No. 4.

G. W. Alford, Sheriff and F. P. Adams, Clerk.

The Court was opened by proclamation of the Sheriff.

Accounts were allowed as per Accounts Allowed Ledger.

The Court appointed H. G. Finley as Constable of Precinct No. 4 and he immediately executed his bond and took the oath of office.

Upon a petition signed by the required number of property tax paying voters in Common School Dist No. 32 asking that a Special School Tax election be held in said District for the purpose of determining whether or not a majority of the property tax paying voters desire to increase the School Tax in said Dist. from .20 cents on the \$100.00 valuation to .50 cents on the \$100.00 valuation of all taxable property in said District for the purpose of supplementing the apportionment made by the State in said District, the Court ordered that an election be held in said District at the School House on August the 10th, 1918 and that R. L. Kirk be appointed Presiding officer.

The Court allowed Jim Giles \$10.00, Miss Nannie Howard \$15.00 and Green Randle \$5.00 as County aid.

The Court ordered that a Third Class Road be opened and established as follows - Beginning at what is known as the Dug out on the San Augustine and Geneva Road and to run in a Northwesterly direction to the San Augustine County line.

The Court ordered the Clerk to issue to each officer his monthly salary.

The Court ordered the Clerk to issue each officer his per diem.

There being no further business the Court adjourned.
