

Commissioners Court met in regular session Jan. 13, 1919 with the following members.

F. E. Adams-----Co. Justice

The Court was opened by proclamation of G. W. Alford Sheriff.

The Court ordered that the Tax Collector accept payment on the real estate of W. E. Claiborne which 92 1/2 acres a part of the M. White and Thomas Dindsey headright at the rate of \$14.00 per acre.

The Court ordered that J. W. Bennett be exempt from public road service on account of injured knee.

The Court ordered that W. R. Armstrong be exempt from public road service on account of an injury caused by a broken leg.

Upon petition by the required number of signers the following change in lower Hemphill and Fairdale road was granted. Beginning at about 1/4 mile south of where P. M. Hammock

now lives thence in a southerly direction intersecting the Yellow Pine and Fairdale road at N. A. Edgars place upon petition signed by required number of residents citizens asking that

3rd class road be established the court granted petition and the road was ordered to be established as follows. Beginning at J. H. Welsh place on the Hemphill and Bronson road

thence running north east direction intersecting the present San Augustine and Hemphill road at a little bridge at the foot of what is known as the Clark hill. The court appointed

J. L. King, M. J. Rice and T. C. Speights as a juror of views to go on the ground and assess any damages that may be done to property by reason of the establishment of said road and

the Clerk was ordered to notify the juror of view to meet on the ground the 25th day of Jan. 1919 upon petition signed by the required number of resident citizens the court ordered that

the following change be made in the road from the dugout to San Augustine Co. Line Beginning at south west corner of W. M. Jones land thence along Jack Cordray line to his south east

corner thence across the Dick Williams tract of land intersecting the San Augustine and Geneva road at a point between the lot and dwelling of Judge Williams the court appointed W. H. Minton

J. C. Webb and H. C. Holder as juror of view to go upon the ground and assess any damages that may be caused to the property along the proposed changed and the clerk was ordered to notify

the juror of views to appear upon the grounds Jan. 25th, 1919.

The Court ordered that the agricultural work be continued in Sabine Co. and agreed to set aside \$600.00 out of Gen. Co. funds to supplement the state and national appropriation.

The court unanimously selected T. J. Fortenberry as agricultural agent for 1919 with understanding that he give his entire time to his work.

The Court authorized the sheriff to employ a janitor at a salary not to exceed \$15.00 per month to take care of the court building and jail.

Accounts were allowed as per accounts ledger.
