The Court having advertised for bids for a County depository for Sabine County to act as such for the next 2 years. The following bid was filed by the Clerk and opened by the court Publicly

Gentlemen:-

We submit the following bid as an applicant for the holding of Sabine Co. funds for the next two years. We will pay 3% interest on average daily balance of Sabine County all funds included said daily balance to be arrived at by allowing us a daily average credit for all Sabine County warrant carried by us. We agree to carry for the County, at par all general warrants issued up to \$10,000.00 we agree to carry at par all Sabine Co. School warrants issued against the State & County appropriation. We agree to carry at par all road & bridge warrants issued up to \$9,000.00 we agree to keep the record of all receipts and disbursements of Sabine Co. School funds and make an annual report of same to the comptroller at Austin free of cost to the county all subject to the county keeping with us during the life of agreement, if accepted the permanent School fund.

The Court Ordered that the Clerk issue a Warrant in favor of First National Bank Hemphill for \$525.23 out of Sabine County road Bond Fund to retire the accrued interest on Sabine County Road Bonds.

The Court ordered that all streets in the town of Hemphill, Texas, be opened out cleared of all obstructions.

Upon petition the court ordered that a first class public road be established and opened as follows: Beginning at the North end of First street west of Court house and continuing north straight with said street and ending at L. H. & G. Ry tract near Hemphill Depot.

The Court ordered that no one except County officers occupy the offices in the Court house.

The Court ordered that the Court house and jail be insured as follows:

\$15000.00 on Court House
5000.00 on Jail

The Court ordered that R. H. Minton with \$10,000.00 and A. M. Jones \$10,000.00

The Court ordered that the County Treas, per cent on funds increased and disbursed be fixed for next quarter.

The Court ordered that the report of Jury of View appointed in the road across Clark's land be reported and Jury of View by allowed \$3.00 per day each.

Report of Jury

The Court approved the quarterly reports of County officers

There being no further business the Court recessed to meet Feb. 17th, 1919.
