

The Hon. Commissioner's Court met in regular session August 11, 1919 with the following members present:

The court was opened by Proclamation of the Sheriff.

The court approved official Bonds of J. P. Whitehead, Constable of Precinct No. 2 of Sabine Co., Texas.

Upon the return of Special School Tax election Common School District # 16 Sabine County Texas, on Aug. 9th, 1919 to determine whether or not the Commissioner's Court should levy assess, collect annually a tax of and at the rate of 50¢ on \$100.00 valuation of all taxable property in said district for the purposes of supplementing the State School fund, found following results: For increase of School tax 20 votes. Against increase School tax 10 votes.

It is therefore ordered by the court that a tax of and at the rate of 50¢ on one hundred dollars valuation of all taxable property be levied, assessed, and collected annually in said Common School District No. 16 Sabine County, Texas.

The court ordered that \$3.25 be transferred from Gen. Co. funds to Road and Bridge fund, in warrant fund, and that \$61.00 be transferred from Gen. Co. fund to Road sinking fund.

Upon petition filed by a required number of property tax paying voters asking that all election be held in common school district No. 14 to determine whether or not a majority of the property tax paying voters desire to issue Bonds in the sum of \$1500.00 for purposes of building and equipping a school building in said district and Sept 10, 1919 set for day of

election and ~~W. H. [unclear]~~ ^{A. R. Carlson} is appointed presiding officer of said election.

There being no further business the court adjourned to meet August 21, 1919.
