

The Commissioner's Court meet in Special Session on Oct. 25, 1919, with the following members present:

The Court was opened by proclamation of the Sheriff.

The Court met for the purposes of receiving bids on State highway No. 8 A, of Sabine County, Texas, from Hemphill to Geneva.

The bids of Smith Bro. & Austin Brothers Bridge Co., for state highway work from Hemphill to Geneva being the only bidders.

The Court voted to employ T. J. Fortenberry as Co. Supervisor and Tick Eradication man.

The three following commissioner's D. A. Easley, C. M. Bennett, J. B. Hargroves voted for T. J. Fortenberry and M. T. Bell voting against T. J. Fortenberry.

Upon motion and second, the court voted that the tick eradication begin Nov. 1st, 1919 and J. B. Hargroves, C. M. Bennett, and D. A. Easley voted in favor of this tick eradication and M. T. Bell voted against it.

Upon motion and second the court voted discontinuance of the Agriculture work for 1920. J. B. Hargroves, C. M. Bennett, M. T. Bell voted for this motion and D. A. Easley voted against continuing the County Agriculture County Work.

Accounts was allowed as per ledger.
