

The Hon. Commissioner's Court met in Special session Nov. 10th, 1919.

The Court was opened by Proclamation of the Sheriff.

Upon motion of the Court Allowed Mrs. Osca Lakey \$24.00 for County Aid to be to A.

Du Bose.

Upon motion duly made and second the court noted to resend the order made at a special meeting of Commissioner's court discontinuing the Agr. work for 1920. D. A. Easley, J. B. Hargroves & C. M. Bennett voting in favor of the motion & M. T. Bell against motion.

Upon motion duly made and second the court voted to put on Agr. work for 1920 with the understanding that he is to assist in dipping work, and agreed to pay \$1000.00 to aid in this work. D. A. Easley, J. B. Hargroves & C. M. Bennett voting in favor of the motion and M. T. Bell voting against.

The returns of amendment election came on to be considered, the following results was declared for first amendment 77 votes, against first amendment 340 votes.

For Second Amendment 139 votes, against Second Amendment 289 votes.

For Third Amendment 97 votes, against Third Amendment 307 votes.

For Fourth Amendment 112 votes, against Fourth Amendment 288 votes.

For Fifth Amendment 47 votes, against Fifth Amendment 347 votes.

For Sixth Amendment 58 votes, against Sixth Amendment 344 votes.

For Seventh Amendment 53 votes, against Seventh Amendment 304 votes.

Upon petition the Court voted to kill the road as follows: the road leading from the Bronson road about one mile from Hemphill and running to the Milam and Bronson Road north of Tebo creek at the Harris place.

Accounts were allowed as per ledger.
