

The Hon. Commissioner's court met in regular session on March 8th 1920.

The Court was opened by Proclamation of the Sheriff, G. W. Alford.

Upon petition the court voted that 313 1/8 acres of land on D. Renfro league belonging to R. D. Smith be incorporated within the Geneva Stock Law Sub-division, said 313 1/8 acres is bounded as follows on the south and east by lands of J. W. Minton, on the north and east by lands of Acie E. B. & D. B. Smith and on the west by lands of the Picker Lumber Co. and southwest of J. D. Ordway.

Upon motion made and second the Court voted to refuse to pay for 554 pine poles at \$5 each turned in by Mr. C. M. Bennett in favor of Mr. A. L. McGowen, J. B. Hargroves, M. T. Bell & D. A. EASLEY voted against allowing account C. M. Bennett for to allow account.

Upon petition of required No. of qualified property tax paying voters in common School district No. 31 asking that a special election in said district to determine whether or not a majority of the qualified voters of said district desires to increase the Local School Tax from .40% to .50% on the one hundred valuation of the taxable property in said district.

The court ordered a election to be held at the School house be held in said district on April 3rd 1920 and that L. W. Tatom, J. F. Bailey & J. W. Lathan be appointed to hold said election.

Upon petition of required No. of qualified property tax paying voters in common School district No. 31 asking that at a special election in said district to determine whether or not a majority of the qualified voters of said district desires to increase the Local School Tax from .35% to .50% on the one hundred valuation of the taxable property in said district.

The court ordered a election to be held at the school house or held in said district on April 3rd. 1920 and that S. W. Tatom, A. J. Lott & H. E. Wagstaff.

Upon petition by W. A. King asking for a franchise to erect and maintain a telephone system upon the streets, public roads and alleys of Sabine Co., Texas, the court granted this

franchise with the under standing that the erection, operation and maintenance of said telephone system would not in anyway interfere with the traffic drainage and use of said streets, public roads and alleys.

The accounts were allowed as per ledger.
