The State officers received the vote as listed in record of election record of Sabine County, Texas, in Vol. 2 pages 26 - 33 inclusive. The results of the amendment were declared as follows: For amendment Sect. 4 Act. 11- 266 votes, Against amendment Sect. 4 11- 270 votes, for amendment Sect. 3 Act. 7- 414 votes agnt. amendment Sect. 3, 7- 216 votes, for ammendment act 16, Sect. 60, 194 votes, Against ammendment 16 Sect. 60, 320 votes. John Harper tendered his resignation as County Supt. Public Instructions of Sabine County, which was excepted and O. P. Pate having received the greatest number of votes in general election held Nov. 2, 1920 for the office of County Supt. Instruction, Mr. O. P. Pate qualified as County Supt. and executed his bond.

Upon petition of the required number of property tax paying voters of common school district No. 31, Sabine County, Tex. asking for election to be held for the purposes of increasing the maintenance tax from 35¢ on \$100.00 valuation to 50¢ on \$100.00 valuation to supplement to State School fund apportionment, the court ordered that an election be held at the school house in said District on 11th of Dec. 1920 and J. M. Porter is here by appointed presiding officer of said election.

F. H. Cooper Public Accountant unpaid by the court to Audit the County Books, made his report and same is accepted by court and the clerk ordered to issue him warrant for \$800.00 amount of his bid.

The Clerk was ordered to issue each of election officers the sum of \$200 for each day served in holding General Election.

The court ordered that the clerk issue to the sheriff a warrant for Exofficio salary beginning Sept. 19th 1920 at the rate of one thousand dollars per year.

Accounts were allowed as per account allowed Ledger.
