Minton for the sum of \$595.00 for tearing down the old Bridge on Pologochs Creek at Speights place and removing and rebuilding same on said creek at Tucker bridge be and the same is hereby accepted said cement work, to be done according to specification on file all work to be performed in a work manlike manner.

Accounts were allowed as per ledger.

It is ordered by the Court that the Clerk that the Clerk issue R. A. Meeks his salary as Janitor in semi -mpnthly payments.

being present, when the following order was passed by a vote of Five votes for its passage to _____ votes against its passage.

WHEREAS, on the 14th day of February, A. D. 1921, the Commissioners' Court of Sabine County passed a certain order authorizing the issuance of interest bearing warrants in the amount of \$20,000.00, for the purpose of refunding Road and Bridge Warrants of said County and directing the execution and delivery of said Road and Bridge Refunding Warrants to the holders of the original outstanding warrants of said County in said order described, upon surrender of the original warrants, said Refunding Warrants being dated February, 14th, 1921, maturing serially 1922 to 1931, inclusive, and bearing interest at the rate of six per cent, (6%) per annum, and in said order levied a tax of 6 cents on the \$100.00 valuation of taxable property in said County out of the constitutional 15 cents Road and Bridge tax of said County, for the purpose of providing for the payment of the interest on said warrants and the principal thereof at maturity; and

WHEREAS, objection to the approval of said Road and Bridge Refunding Warrants has been urged by the Attorney of the purchaser thereof, because the record of proceedings had in their issuance does not disclose to the satisfaction of said Attorney that the remainder of said 15 cents constitutional Road and Bridge tax authorized to be levied and which was and is unappropriated, was sufficient to raise and would afford the Commissioners' Court of said County ample revenues from which to pay the current expenses of said County for road and bridge purposes for future years so long as said Refunding Warrants are outstanding;

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED AND HEREBY DECLARED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS, that in the passage of said order, of date aforesaid, this Court determined the validity of said original warrants, determined the advisability of refunding same and postponing the payment thereof by the payment of interest thereon and after duly considering the financial condition of said County and of its road and bridge funds, determined that after making the levy and appropriation of the tax of six cents therein levied, together with other taxes and appropriation made and pledged from said road and bridge tax, there remained un-appropriated a sufficient amount of said tax and said fund to meet the current expenses of said Sabine County for road and bridge purposes for each year from 1921 to 1931, inclusive, and it is so declared by this Court.

D. 1921, the Commissioners' Court of Sabine County, passed a certain order authorizing the issuance of interest bearing warrants in the amount of \$25,000.00, for the purpose of refunding General Fund Warrants of said County and directing the execution and delivery of said Refunding Warrants to the of said County in said order described, upon surrender of the original warrants, said Refunding Warrants being dated February, 15th, 1921, maturing serially 1922 to 1935, inclusive, and bearing interest at the rate of six per cent, (6%) per annum, and in said order levied a tax of 7¢ on the \$100.00 valuation of taxable property in said County out of the constitutional 25¢ general tax of said County, for the purpose of providing for the payment of the interest on said warrants and the principal thereof at maturity; and

WHEREAS, objection to the approval of said Refunding Warrants has been urged by the Attorney of the purchaser thereof, because the record of proceedings had in their issuance does not disclose to the satisfaction of said Attorney that the remainder of said 25¢ constitutional general tax authorized to be levied and which was and is unappropriated was sufficient to raise and would afford the Commissioners Court of said County ample revenues from which to pay the current expenses of said County for future years so long as said Refunding Warrants are outstanding;

To the Honorable Commissioners Court of Sabine County Texas:

We the undersigned being resident citizens within the hereinafter described territory situated in Sabine County Texas, respectfully represent.

First. That we are resident property tax paying voters within said territory.

Second. That we desire your Honorable body to order an election to determine whether or not the bonds of said territory to be known and designated as "Road District No. 2, of Sabine County, Texas" shall be issued in the Amount of FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$50,000.00) bearing five and one-half per cent rate of interest, and maturing at such times as may be fixed by the Commissioners Court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed thirty years from date hereof, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turn pikes, or in aid thereof; and whether or not a tax shall be levied upon the property of said proposed Road District, subject to taxation, for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity.

Third. That the territory which we pray your Honorable body to designate as "Road District No. 2, of Sabine County, Texas," is accurately described by metes and bounds to-wit:

Beginning in said Sabine County, Texas, at the mouth of Patroon Creek on the west bank of Sabine River. Thence up said creek with its meanders to the N. E. corner of the James Gaines League. Thence N. 81 W. with the N. Line of said James Gaines League to its N. W. corner. Thence S. 9 W. with the W. line of said James Gaines League to the S. E. corner of the James Mason League. Thence S. 73 West with the south line of said James Mason League to the N. E. corner of the Isaac Powell League. Thence S. with the E. line of said Isaac Powell League to the old Milam and Pendleton Road. Thence westerly with said Milam and Pendleton old road to a point where said old road intersects the road leading from Milam to Sabinetown. Thence Westerly with said Milam and Sabinetown road to a point where said road intersects a graded road leading from Hemphill to Isla, via Milam. Thence Southerly with the said Milam and Sabinetown road to a point where said road intersects the Hemphill and Geneva public road. Thence Southerly with the East Side of said Hemphill and Geneva road to a point where said road crosses the South boundary line of the Isaac Carrodine survey. Thence N. 48-1/4 east with the South line of said Carrodine survey to the N. E. corner of the George W. King land, same being the N. W. corner of the 41 acre tract of land owned by the Temple Lumber Company and formerly owned by J. T. Davidson, et al. Thence Southerly with the various west boundary lines of said 41 acres, to its S. W. corner. Thence N. 86-1/2 E. 391 vrs to the N. E. corner of a 210 acre tract owned by J. W. Meador, et al, a point on the west line of the Moses Hill League. Thence S. 408 vrs.; Thence N. 46-1/2 E. 175 vrs. Thence N. 3 East 357 vrs. to a ditch. Thence with said Ditch to another corner of the Goodrich 320 acres. Thence N. 12 E. 479 vrs to the N. W. corner of said Goodrich 320 acres, on the South line of 74 acres heretofore owned by J. T. Davidson. Thence N. 77 E. to the N. W. corner of the H. B. Arnold, et al, 263 acres. Thence with the west line of said Arnold et al, 263 acres in a southerly direction to the Pologoche creek. Thence down said Pologoche creek with its meanders to the east line of the Moses Hill survey. Thence Southerly with Moses Hills east boundary line to the S. W. Corner of the A. L. Frazier survey. Thence east with the South line of the A. L. Frazier survey 2700 vrs. to said A. L. Frazier's S. E. corner. Thence North with A. L. Frazier's East line to the S. E. corner of the J. A. Hines survey. Thence N. 31 E. on the East line of the J. A. Hines survey to the Pologoche Creek. Thence down the Pologoche Creek with its meanders to where it empties into Sabine River. Thence up Sabine River with its meanders to the place of beginning.

Fourth. That the above described territory is situated wholly within Sabine County, Texas, and does not over-lap or embrace any part of a political subdivision or defined Road District that has heretofore been established and issued road bonds which are now outstanding and unpaid.
