The State of Texas,

County of Sabine. On this the 16th day of March, A. D. 1921, the Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas, convened in regular session, at the regular meeting place thereof in the Court-house at Hemphill, Sabine County, Texas, all members of the Court, to-wit:

- W. C. Arnold, County Judge.
- J. A. Ragan, Commissioner of Precinct No. 1,
- Jerry Ball Commissioner of Precinct No. 2.
- S. H. Hall Commissioner of Precinct No. 3.
- A. T. Matthews, Commissioner of Precinct No. 4.

being present, came on to be considered the petition of E. D. Low and nineteen other persons, praying that bonds be issued by "Road District No. 2, of Sabine County, Texas" in the sum of \$50,000.00, bearing five and one half per cent rate of interest, maturing at such times as may be fixed by the Commissioners Court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed thirty years from date thereof, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turn pikes, or in aid thereof, and whether or not a tax shall be levied upon the property of said Road District No. 2 of Sabine County, Texas, subject to taxation, for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity; and.

It appearing to the Court that said petition is signed by a majority of the resident property tax paying voters of said Road District No. 2, of Sabine County, Texas, and,

It further appearing that the amount of bonds to be issued will not exceed one fourth of the assessed valuation of the real property of said Road District No. 2, of Sabine County, Texas;

And it further appearing that said Road District No. 2, of Sabine County, Texas, has been duly established by an order of the Commissioners Court of Sabine County, dated the 16th day of March, A. D. 1921, of record in Book "L" pages 458, of the Minutes of said Court, and the boundaries thereof are herein described as described and defined in the order of the Commissioners Court establishing such District, as follows, to-wit:

Beginning in Sabine County, Texas, at the North of the Patroon creek on the west bank of Sabine River. Thence up said creek with its meanders to the N. E. corner of the James Gaines League. Thence N. 81 W. with the N. line of said James Gaines League to its N. W. Corner. Thence S. 9 W. with the W. line of said James Gaines league. to the S. E. corner of the James Mason league. Thence S. 73 West with the South line of said James Mason League to the N. E. corner of the Isaac Powell League. Thence S. with the E. line of said Isaac Powell league to the old Milam and Pendleton road. Thence westerly with said Milam and Pendleton old road to a point where said old road intersects the road leading from Milam to Sabinetown. Thence westerly with said Milam and Sabinetown

road to a point where said road intersects a graded road leading from Hemphill to the
 Ave. Milam. Thence southerly with the said Milam and Sabine town road to a point where
 said road intersects the Hemphill and Geneva public road. Thence southerly with the east
 side of said Hemphill and Geneva road to a point where said road crosses the south boundary
 line of the Lazo Carridine survey. Thence N 48-1/4 east with the south line of said Carr-
 idine survey to the N. E. corner of the George W. King. Land same being the N. W. corner
 of the 41 acre tract of land owned by the Temple Lumber Company and formerly owned by J. T.
 Davidson et al. Thence southerly with the various west boundary lines of said 41 acres to
 S. W. corner. Thence N 86-1/2 E. 391 vrs. to the N. E. corner of a 210 acre tract owned
 by J. W. Meador, et al. a point on the west line of the Moses Hill League. Thence S. 408
 vrs. Thence N 46-1/2 E. 175 vrs. Thence N 3 East 357 vrs to a ditch. Thence with said
 ditch to another corner of the Goodrich 320 acres. Thence N 12 E. 479 vrs to the N. W.
 corner of said Goodrich 320 acres, on the south line 74 acres heretofore owned by J. T.
 Davidson. Thence N 77 E. to the N. W. corner of the H. B. Arnold, et al. 263 acres. Thence
 with the west line of said Arnold, et al. 263 acres, in a southerly direction to the
 Pologoch creek. Thence down said Pologoch creek with its meanders to the east line
 of the Moses Hill survey. Thence southerly with Moses Hill's east boundary line to the
 S. W. corner of the A. L. Brazier survey. Thence east with the south line of the A. L.
 Brazier survey 2700 vrs. to said A. L. Brazier S. E. corner. Thence North with A. L.
 Brazier East line to the S. E. corner of the J. A. Hines survey. Thence N 31 east on the
 east line of the J. A. Hines survey, to the Pologoch creek. Thence down the Pologoch creek
 with its meanders toward its empties into Sabine River. Thence up Sabine River with its
 meanders to the place of beginning, and being the same description of said territory as
 given in said petition; and

It further appearing that said District does not embrace any part of a politi-
 cal sub-division or defined head District that has been heretofore established and has re-
 sulted bonds which are now outstanding and unpaid;

IT IS THEREFORE CONSIDERED AND ORDERED by the court that an election be held
 in said head District No. 2, of Sabine County, Texas, on the 16th day of April, A. D. 1921,
 which is not less than thirty days from the date of this order, to determine whether or not
 the bonds of said head District No. 2, of Sabine County, Texas, shall be issued in the a-
 mount of \$50,000.00, bearing five and one half per cent rate of interest, and maturing
 at such times as may be fixed by the Commissioners Court, serially or otherwise, not to
 a tax shall be levied upon the property of said head District No. 2, of Sabine County
 Texas subject to taxation, for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds, and to
 provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity.

The said election shall be held under the provisions of Articles 627 to 641
 inclusive, of Chapter 2, Title 18, Revised Statutes 1911, as amended by Section 1, Chapter
 203, Acts of 1917, regular session.

All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and of this County
 and who are resident property tax payers in head District No. 2, of Sabine County, Texas
 shall be entitled to vote at said election, and all voters desiring to support the prop-
 osition to issue the bonds shall have written or printed on their ballots the words:
 "For the issuance of bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof";
 and those opposed shall have written or printed on their ballots the words:
 "Against the issuance of bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof".
 The polling place and presiding officer of said election shall be ascertained
 as follows: At the Allen and Mill School house commonly known as Lower Chapel in Sabi-

District No. 19, with J. T. McGawn as presiding officer. The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the general laws of the State of Texas, regulating general elections, when not in conflict with the provisions of the Statutes hereinabove referred to.

Notice of said election shall be given by publication of a copy of this order in the Sabine County Reporter, a newspaper published in the County of Sabine for four successive weeks before the date of said election and in addition thereto, there shall be posted other copies of this order at three public places in Road District No. 2, of Sabine County, Texas, for three weeks prior to said Election.

The County Judge is hereby directed to cause said notices to be posted as hereinabove directed, and further orders are reserved until the returns of said Election are made by the duly authorized Election Officers and received by this Court.
