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ORDER OF COMMISSIONERS COURT ESTABLISHING  
ROAD DISTRICT NO. 1, OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS.

The State of Texas,

County of Sabine. On this the 21st day of March A. D. 1921, the County Commissioners Court convened in special session, at the regular meeting place thereof in the Courthouse at Hemphill, Sabine County, Texas, all the members of said Court to-wit:

W. C. Arnold, County Judge.

J. A. Ragan, Commissioner Precinct No. 1.

Jerry Bell, Commissioner Precinct No. 2.

S. H. Hall, Commissioner Precinct No. 3.

A. T. Matthews, Commissioner Precinct No. 4,

being present and passed the following order:

WHEREAS, a petition signed by J. W. Mitchell, and 31 other persons, has this day been presented to this Court, praying that bonds be issued in the sum of \$70,000.00 for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, gravelled or paved roads and turn-pikes, or in aid thereof, within the territory therein defined and which said petitioners pray this Court to create as a road district, to be known and designated as "Road District No. 1" of Sabine County, Texas, and

IT APPEARING to the Court that said petition bears the requisite number of signature of resident property tax paying voters within the proposed road district; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING to the Court that it is desirable to establish said road district; and,

IT FURTHER APPEARING to the Court that the boundaries of said proposed district as described and defined in said petition do not overlap or embrace any part of a political subdivision or defined road district that has heretofore been established and issued road bonds which are now outstanding and unpaid; and,

IT FURTHER APPEARING to the Court that all the territory to be included within said proposed district is wholly within Sabine County, Texas;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas:

1.

That Road District No. 1, of Sabine County, Texas in the State of Texas, be, and the same is hereby established within the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning in said Sabine County, Texas, at the Southeast corner of Sabine County, same being the northeast corner of Newton County, Texas, at a point on the west

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bank of Sabine River.

Thence westerly with the line between Sabine and Newton Counties to a point where said line crosses the west boundary line of the M. W. Anthony pre-emption survey. Thence North 25 west with M. W. Anthony's west line to the Northwest corner of said survey on the South line of the Theo Koester survey No. 6. Thence North 63 east to the southeast corner of said Koester survey. Thence North 27 west with the east line of said Koester survey, No. 6, and the east line of the G. H. S. A. R. Co. Survey, No. 6, same being the west lines of the G. L. Love, and S. L. Dainwood surveys, to the S. Boundary line of the Aurelia Russell League. Thence S 63 W. with the south boundary line of said Aurelia Russell League to its Southwest corner. Thence N 27 west with the west lines of said Aurelia Russell League and the A. W. Canfield league to the Northwest corner of said A. W. Canfield league. Thence south 63 west with the S. boundary line of the Henry Canfield League to its S. W. corner. Thence North 27 west with the west line of said Henry Canfield League to its Northwest corner. Thence North 73 east with the North line of said Henry Canfield League to the southwest corner of the Robert Russell 1/4 league. Thence North 27 west with the west line of said Robert Russell 1/4 league 728 yrs. to the Northwest corner of a 239-1/2 acre subdivision of said Robert Russell survey. Thence N 62-1/2 E. with the North line of said 239-1/2 acre subdivision to Six Mile Creek. Thence down the Six Mile Creek in a south easterly direction with the meanders of said creek to the S.W. corner to the S. W. corner of the A. C. Ball 160 acre preemption. Thence N 66 E. with the S. line of the A. C. Ball preemption to its S. E. corner. Thence N. 24 west with the East line of the A. C. Ball preemption to its N. E. corner. Thence N 66 E. with the south line of the W. G. Edgar Pre-emption to the S. E. corner of said W. G. Edgar Pre-emption. Thence N. 24 west with the east line of the W. G. Edgar Pre-emption to its N. E. corner on the west line of the John S. Chiveral survey. Thence N 25 west with the west boundary line of the John S. Chiveral survey. to its N. W. corner on the South boundary line of the G. L. Beurland league. Thence N 64 East with the N. line of the John S. Chiveral survey. and the S. line of the G. L. Beurland league to the Housen Bayou. Thence down the Housen Bayou. with its meanders to the Mouth of Sulphur Slough. Thence up the Sulphur Slough in a southerly direction to where said Slough crosses the N. line of the E. M. Carlton 640 acre survey. Thence N. 67-1/2 E. with the N. line of the E. M. Carlton 640 acre survey to its N. E. corner. Thence South 25 East with said E. M. Carlton's East boundary line to the North line of the Henry Canfield League. Thence N 67-1/2 E. with the N. line of the Henry Canfield League to its N. E. corner on the west bank of Sabine river. Thence down the Sabine River with its meanderings to the place of beginning, at the Southeast corner of Sabine County.

III.

That said Road District, No. 1, of Sabine County, Texas, is hereby established for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, within and for said District, under and by virtue of the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, including Chapter 2, Title 18, Revised Statutes, 1911, as amended by Chapter 203, Act, of 1917, Regular session and Chapter 18, acts Fourth called session of the Thirty-fifth Legislature, and the said district is hereby made and created a body corporate.

III.

It is further ordered by the Court that if the proposition to issue \$70,000.00 road bonds, as prayed for in said petition does not receive a two-thirds majority of the vote cast at the election to be ordered by this Court for the purpose of determining whether or now said bonds shall be issued by said district, then this order shall become wholly

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null and void, but if said proposition shall receive such necessary favorable vote this order shall then remain in full force and effect while said bonds, or any of them, are outstanding obligation of said road district.
