

NOTICE OF ROAD BOND ELECTION.

The State of Texas,
County of Sabine To the resident property tax paying voters of Road District No. 1,
of Sabine County, Texas

TAKE NOTICE that an election will be held on the 23rd day of April A. D. 1921, with Road District No. 1, of Sabine County, Texas, to determine if said District shall issue bonds and if a tax shall be levied in payment thereof, in obedience to an election order entered by the Commissioners Court on the 21st day of March A. D. 1921, which is as follows:

On this the 21st day of March A. D. 1921, the Commissioners Court of Sabine County Texas, convened in special session at the regular meeting place thereof in the courthouse at Hemphill, Sabine County, Texas, all members of the Court-to-wit:

being present, came on to be considered the petition of J. W. Mitchell and 31 other persons, praying that bonds be issued by Road District No. 1, of Sabine County, Texas in the sum of \$70,000.00, bearing five and one half per cent rate of interest, maturing at such times as may be fixed by the Commissioners Court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed thirty years from date thereof, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, and whether or not a tax shall be levied upon the property of said Road District No. 1, of Sabine County, Texas, subject, to taxation for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity; and,

It appearing to the Court that said petition is signed by a majority of the resident property tax paying voters of said Road District No. 1, of Sabine County, Texas, and,

It further appearing that the amount of bonds to be issued will not exceed one-fourth of the assessed valuation of the real property of said Road District No. 1, of Sabine County, Texas,

And it further appearing that said Road District No. 1, of Sabine County, Texas, has been duly established by an order of the Commissioners Court of Sabine County, dated the 21st day of March, A. D. 1921, of record in Book "L" page 468, of the Minutes of said Court, and the boundaries thereof are herein described as described and defined in the order of the Commissioners Court establishing such District as follows, to-wit:

Beginning in said Sabine County, Texas, at the Southeast corner of Sabine County, same being the Northeast corner of Newton County, Texas, at a point on the west bank of Sabine River. Thence westerly with the line between Sabine and Newton Counties to a point where said line crosses the west boundary line of the M. W. Anthony Pre-emption survey. Thence North 25 west with M. W. Anthony's west line to the Northwest corner of said survey on the south line of the Theo Koester survey No. 6, Thence North 63 east to the southeast corner of said Koester survey. Thence North 27 west with the east line of said Koester survey, No. 6, and the east line of the G. H. & S. A. R. R. Co, survey, No. 6, same being the west lines of the C. L. Love and S. L. Dainwood surveys to the S. boundary line of the Aurelia Russell League. Thence S 63 W. with the South boundary line of said Aurelia Russell League to its Southwest corner. Thence N 27 west with the west lines of said Aurelia Russell League and the A. W. Canfield League to the northwest corner of said A. W. Canfield

League. Thence south 63 west with the S. boundary line of the Henry Canfield League to its S. W. corner. Thence North 27 west with the west line of said Henry Canfield League to its Northwest corner. Thence North 63 east with the North line of said Canfield League to the Southwest corner of the Robert Russell 1/4 league. Thence North 27 west with the west line of said Robert Russell 1/4 league 728 vms to the Northwest corner of a 239-1/2 acre sub-division of said Robert Russell survey. Thence N 62-1/2 E. with the North line of said 239-1/2 acre sub-division to Six mile creek. Thence down the Six Mile Creek in a south easterly direction with the meanders of said creek to the S.W. corner of the A. C. Ball 160 acre pre-emption. Thence N 66 E. with the S. line of the A. C. Ball pre-emption to its S.E. corner. Thence N 24 west with the east line of the A. C. Ball Pre-emption to its N. E. corner. Thence N 66 E. with the south line of the W. G. Edgar Pre-emption to the S. E. corner of said W. G. Edgar Pre-emption. Thence N 24 west with the east line of the W. G. Edgar Pre-emption to its N. E. corner on the west line line of the John S. Chivaler survey. Thence N. 25 west with the west boundary line of the John S. Chivaler survey to its N. W. corner on the South boundary line of the G. L. Bourland league. Thence N. 64 east with the N. line of the John S. Chivaler, survey, and the S. line of the G. L. Bourland League to the Housen Bayou. Thence down the Housen Bayou with its meanders to the mouth of Sulphur Slough. Thence up the the Sulphur Slough in a southerly direction to where said Slough crosses the N. line of the E. M. Carlton 640 acre survey. Thence N 67--1/2 E. with the N. line of the E. M. Carlton 640 acres survey to its N. E. corner. Thence South 25 east with said E. M. Carltons East boundary line to the North line of the Henry Canfield league. Thence N. 67-1/2 E. with the N. line of the Henry Canfield League to its N. E. corner on the west bank of Sabine River. Thence down the Sabine River with its meanderings to the place of beginning, at the Southeast corner of Sabine County, and being the same description of said territory as given in said petition; and

It further appearing that said district does not embrace any part of a political sub-division or defined road district that has been heretofore established and has issued bonds which are now outstanding and unpaid;

IT IS THEREFORE CONSIDERED AND ORDERED by the court that an election be held in said Road District No. 1, of Sabine County, Texas, on the 23rd day of April A.D. 1921, which is not less than thirty days from the date of this order, to determine whether or not the bonds of said Road District No. 1, of Sabine County, Texas, shall be issued in the amount of \$70,00.00, bearing five and one half per cent rate of interest, and maturing at such times as may be fixed by the Commissioners Court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed thirty years from the date thereof, and whether or not a tax shall be levied upon the property of said Road District No. 1 of Sabine County, Texas, subject to taxation, for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity.

The said election shall be held under the provisions of Articles 627 to 641, inclusive, of Chapter 2, Title 18, Revised Statutes, 1911, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 203, Acts, of 1917, Special Session.

All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and of this County and who are resident property tax payers in Road District No. 1, of Sabine County, Texas, shall be entitled to vote at said election, and all voters desiring to support the proposition to issue the bonds shall have written or printed on their ballots the words:

"For the issuances of bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."

And those opposed shall have written or printed on their ballots the words:

"Against the issuance of bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."

The polling place and presiding officer of said election shall be respectively as follows:

At the Fairdale School-house with Roy Rogers as presiding officer.

The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the general laws of the State of Texas, regulating general elections, when not in conflict with the provisions of the Statutes hereinabove referred to.

Notice of said election shall be given by publication of a copy of this order in the Sabine County Reporter, a news-paper published in the County of Sabine for four successive weeks before the date of said election, and in addition thereto, there shall be posted other copies of this order at three public places in Road District No. 1, of Sabine County, Texas, for three weeks prior to said Election.

The County Judge is hereby directed to cause said Notices to be published and posted, as hereinabove directed, and further orders are reserved until the returns of said election are made by the fully authorized Election Officers and received by this Court.

D. 1921, of record in Book "I" pages 458, of the Minutes of said Court, and the boundaries thereof are herein described as described and defined in the order of the Commissioners Court establishing such District, as follows, to-wit:

Beginning in Sabine County, Texas, at the mouth of the Patroon Creek on the west bank of Sabine River. Thence up said Creek with its meanders to the N. E. corner of the James Gaines League. Thence N 81 W. with the N. line of said Gaines league to its N.W. corner. Thence S. 9 W. with the W. line of said James Gaines League to the S. E. corner of the James Mason league. Thence S. 73 West with the South line of said James Mason League to the N. E. corner of the Isaac Powell League. Thence S. with the E. line of said Isaac Powell league. to the old Milam and Pendleton road. Thence westerly with said Milam and Pendleton old road to a point where said old road intersects the road leading from Milam to Sabinetown. Thence westerly with said Milam and Sabinetown road to a point where said road intersects a graded road leading from Hemphill to Isla via. Milam. Thence Southerly with the said Milam and Sabinetown road to a point where said road intersects the Hemphill and Geneva public road. Thence Southerly with the East side of said Hemphill and Geneva road to a point where said road crosses the south boundary line of the Isaac Carrodine survey. Thence N. 48-1/4 East with the South line of said Carrodine survey to the N. E. corner of the George W. King land, same being the N. W. corner of the 41 acre tract of land owned by the Temple Lumber Company and formerly owned by J. T. Davidson et al, Thence Southerly with the various west boundary lines of said 41 acres to its S.W. corner. Thence N. 86-1/2 E. 391 vrs to the N. E. corner of a 210 acre tract owned by J. W. Meador, et al a point on the west line of the Moses Hill survey. Thence S. 408 vrs. Thence N 46-1/2 E. 175 vrs. Thence N 3 E. 357 vrs to a ditch. It further appearing that said District does embrace any part of a political sub-division or defined Road District that has been heretofore established and has issued bonds which are now outstanding and unpaid.

IT IS THEREFORE CONSIDERED AND ORDERED by the Court that an Election be held in said Road District No. 2, of Sabine County, Texas, on the 16th day of April A. D. 1921, which is not less than thirty days from the date of this order, to determine whether or not the bonds of said Road District No. 2, of Sabine County, Texas, shall be issued in the amount of \$50,000.00 bearing five and one half per cent rate of interest, and maturing at such times as may be fixed by the Commissioners' Court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed thirty years from the date thereof, and whether or not a tax shall be levied upon the property of said Road District No. 2, of Sabine County, Texas subject to taxation for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity.

The said election shall be held under the provisions of Articles 627 to 641 inclusive of Chapter 2, Title 18, Revised Statutes 1911, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 203 Acts, of 1917 regular session.

Notice of said Election shall be given by publication of a copy of this order in the Sabine County Reporter, a news paper published in the County of Sabine four successive weeks before the date of said election and in addition thereto, there shall be posted other copies of this order at three public places in Road District No. 2, of Sabine County, Texas, for three weeks prior to said Election.

The County Judge is hereby directed to cause said notices to be published and posted as hereinabove directed and further orders are reserved until the returns of said election are made by the duly authorized Election Officers and received by this Court.
