

ELECTION ORDER.

THE STATE OF TEXAS.

COUNTY OF SABINE

On this the 11th day of April A.D. 1921, the Commissioners Court of Sabine county, Texas, convened in regular session, at the regular meeting place thereof in the courthouse at Hemphill, Texas, all members of the court, to-wit:

W. C. Arnold County Judge.

J. A. Ragan Commissioner of Precinct No. 1.

Jerry Ball Commissioner of precinct No. 2.

S. H. Hall Commissioner of precinct No. 3.

A. T. Matthews, commissioner of precinct No. 4, being

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present, came on to be considered the petition of M. B. Thomas and 34 other persons praying that bonds be issued by "Road District No. 6, of Sabine county, Texas, in the sum of \$45,000.00 bearing five and one half per cent rate of interest, maturing at such times as may be fixed by the commissioners court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed thirty years from date thereof for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, and whether or not a tax shall be levied upon the property of said road District No. 6, of Sabine County, Texas, subject to taxation, for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity; and,

It appearing to the court that said petition is signed by a majority of the resident property taxpaying voters of said road district No. 6, of Sabine county, Texas; and,

It further appearing that the amount of bonds to be issued will not exceed one fourth of the assessed valuation of the real property of said Road District No. 6, of Sabine County, Texas; and,

It further appearing that said Road District No. 6, of Sabine county, Texas, has been duly established by an order of the commissioners court of Sabine county, dated the 11th day of April A. D. 1921, of record in Book "L" pages _____, of the minutes of said court, and the boundaries thereof are herein described as described and defined in the order of the commissioners court establishing such district, as follows, to-wit:

Beginning in said Sabine county, Texas, at a point on the Pologocho creek where said creek crosses the east boundary line of the Moses Hill survey.

Thence S 9 W with Moses Hill east boundary line to the S. W. corner of the A. L. Frazier survey.

Thence east with A. L. Frazier's S. B. line to the north east corner of the J. S. Lacy league.

Thence south with the east line of the J. S. Lacy league to the northeast corner of a fifty acre tract on said league known as the Walker tract.

Thence west with the north line of said Walker 50 acre tract and the north line of a 50 acre tract owned by A. D. Hamilton, et als and the north line of a 100 acre tract owned by A. D. Hamilton, et al to the east boundary line to the Moosa Jackson 160 acre subdivision.

Thence south with the east line of said Moosa Jackson subdivision to the south line of the Jno. S. Lacy league.

Thence east with Jno. S. Lacy's S. B. line to the E. W. corner of the Martha Bullock survey.

Thence S. with Martha Bullock's W. B. line to its southwest corner.

Thence east with Martha Bullock's south line to the northeast corner of T & N O R R Section 3, on the S. line of said Martha Bullock survey.

Thence S with the east line of T & N O R R Co. Sec. 3, to the S W corner of T & N O R R Co. Sec. 4.

Thence east with the S. line of T & N O Sec. 4, to the west line of H E & W T Sec. No. 7.

Thence north with the west line of H E & W T Sec. 7, to its N W corner.

Thence east with the north line of H E & W T Sec. 7 to its N E corner.

Thence S with the east line of H E & W T Sec. 7, to its S E corner on the north line of T & N O Sec. 8.

Thence east on the north line of T & N O Sec. 8 to the northeast corner of said section.

Thence S 1 W with the east line of T & N O Sec. 8 to its S E corner.

Thence west with the south line of T & N O Sec. 8, to the north east corner of the Ben Slaughter survey.

Thence south with the east line of the Ben Slaughter survey to its S E corner.

Thence west with the south line of the Ben Slaughter to the most eastern corner of fractional part of Sec. 8 T & N O R R Co. survey.

Thence S 70 W with the south line of fractional part of T & N O Sec. 8, to the N. E. corner of the Wm. Palmer survey.

Thence S 21 E with Palmer's east line to the G. L. Bourland north league line.

Thence S 69 W. with G. L. Bourland's north league line to its northwest corner.

Thence S 26 E with G. L. Bourland's west line to the S. E. corner of a 398 acre survey subdivision of the Jesse Low survey.

Thence S 87 1/2 W with the south line of said 398 acre subdivision to corner.

Thence S 70 W with the south line of said 398 acre subdivision and the north line of a 66 1/2 acres owned by M. T. Bell, to the Hemphill and Fairdale public road.

Thence in a northwesterly direction with said Hemphill and Fairdale public road to a point where said road crosses the west line of a 1126 acre subdivision of the Henry Nichols league owned by the Temple Lumber Company.

Thence north 20 W with the west line of said 1126 acre subdivision to the southeast corner of a 103 acre subdivision on the Henry Nichols league owned by J. R. Chapman.

Thence S 70 W with the south line of said Chapman 103 acre subdivision to its S W corner

Thence N 32 W with the W. boundary line of said Chapman 103 acres to Bater Battle's N E corner.

Thence N 20 W with the W. B. line of said Chapman 103 acres to its N W corner on the north line of the Henry Nichols league.

Thence W with Henry Nichols north league line to where said line crosses the Hemphill and Fairdale public road.

Thence northwest with said Hemphill and Fairdale public road to where said line crosses the east boundary line of the John Haley league.

Thence north 17 W with John Halleys east boundary line to the S. E. corner of the Ben Jackson survey.

Thence north 10 1/2 E with the east line of the Ben Franklin survey to its N E corner same being the S. E. corner of the Joseph Walker league.

Thence S 75 1/2 W with Joseph Walker's S. B. line to where said line crosses the Hemphill and Fairdale public road.

Thence northwesterly with said road to the east boundary line of a 12 acre subdivision of the Joseph Walker league owned by G. E. Pratt.

Thence north with the S. B. line of G. E. Pratt's 12 acres to his N. E. corner.

Thence west with the N. line of said G. E. Pratt's 12 acres to the east line of the town of Hemphill.

Thence north with the east line of the town of Hemphill to the S. W. corner of the Sherrod Emanuel 5 acre subdivision.

Thence east with the south line of said Emanuel 5 acre subdivision to its S E corner.

Thence north with the east line of the Sherrod Emanuel 5 acre subdivision to its N E corner.

Thence east 386 vrs with the S. line of the Fuller subdivision to its S E corner.

Thence north with the east line of the Fuller subdivision to the public road leading from Hemphill to Milam.

Thence in a northeasterly direction with said Hemphill and Milam public road to the S. B. line of the Jno. S. Lane league.

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Thence north 78 1/2 E with Jno. S. Lane's S.-N. line to the S. W. corner of a subdivision of said league owned by W. R. Pickering Lumber Company.

Thence north 12 W with Pickering Lumber Company's W. B. line to the Pologoch Bayou.

Thence down said Pologoch Bayou with its meandersings to the place of beginning, and being the same description of said territory as given in said petition; and,

It further appearing that said district does not embrace any part of a political subdivision or defined road district that has been heretofore established and has issued bonds which are now outstanding and unpaid.

It is therefore considered and ordered by the court that an election be held in said road district No. 6, of Sabine county, Texas, on the 14th day of May A. D. 1921 which is not less than thirty days from the date of this order, to determine whether or not the bonds of said road district No. 6, of Sabine county, Texas, shall be issued in the amount of \$45,000.00, bearing five and one half per cent rate of interest, and maturing at such times as may be fixed by the commissioners court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed thirty years from the date thereof, and whether or not a tax shall be levied upon the property of said Road District No. 6, Sabine county, Texas, subject to taxation for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity.

The said election shall be held under the provisions of Article 627 to 641 inclusive, of Chapter 2, Title 18, Revised Statutes 1911, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 203, Acts of 1917, Regular session.

All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and of this county and who are resident property taxpayers in Road District No. 6, of Sabine county, Texas, shall be entitled to vote at said election, and all voters desiring to support the proposition to issue the bonds shall have written or printed on their ballots the words:

"For the issuance of bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."

And those opposed shall have written or printed on their ballots the words:

Against the issuance of bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."

The polling places and presiding officers of said election shall be respectively as follows:

At Hemphill colored school house known as the sunlight colored church, with S. H. Tinsley as presiding Officer.

The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the general laws of the State of Texas, regulating general elections, when not in conflict with the provisions of the Statutes hereinabove referred to.

Notice of said election shall be given by publication of a copy of this order in the Sabine county Reporter a newspaper published in the county of Sabine State of Texas, for four successive weeks before the date of said election and in addition thereto, there shall be posted other copies of this order at three public places in road District No. 6, of Sabine County, Texas, for three weeks prior to said election.

The county judge is hereby directed to cause said notices to be published and posted, as hereinabove directed, and further orders are reserved until the returns of said election are made by the duly authorized election officers and received by this court.

PETITION TO THE COMMISSIONERS COURT FOR ROAD DISTRICT

BONDS AND FOR CREATION OF ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 8,

SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS.

To the Honorable commissioners court of Sabine County:

We, the undersigned, being resident citizens within the hereinafter described territory situated in Sabine county, Texas, respectfully represent:

First. That we are resident property tax paying voters within said territory.

Second. That we desire your Honorable body to order an election to determine whether or not the bonds of said territory, to be known and designated as "Road District No. 8, of Sabine county, Texas, shall be issued in the amount of \$2000.00 bearing five and one half per cent rate of interest, and maturing at such times as may be fixed by the commissioners court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed thirty years from date thereof, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes or in aid thereof; and whether or not a tax shall be levied upon the property of said proposed road district, subject to taxation for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity.

Third. That the territory which we pray your Honorable body to designate as "Road District number 8, of Sabine County Texas," is accurately described by metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning in Sabine county, Texas, at the N. W. cor. of the James McKim lg. Thence S 41° west with McKim's west line to the south west cor, of said lg. Thence S 49° E with S. line said McKim lg. 512 varas to the N E cor of the A. E. C. Johnson lg. where same conflicts with the Samuel Nelson & lg. Thence with the east line of said A E C Johnson lg. to its S E cor. on the bank of McKim creek. Thence up said McKim creek with its meanders to the east line of the M. Cummings lg. Thence N 41° east with the east line said Cummings lg. to its N E cor. on the south line of the James McKim lg. thence N 49° W with south line McKim lg. to the S. E. cor. of the west 1/4 of said lg. thence N 41° E with divisional line of the McKim lg. to the S W cor of the John Brandon 500 acre tract, thence S 49° E with S. line said Brandon 500 acres 316 varas to the S. W. cor of 247 acres owned by Est. of Alex'r. & C C Gilmer Dec'd. thence N 76° E 1619 varas. Thence N 64° E 370 varas to the N. W. cor said Gilmer 247 acres on north line said McKim lg. Thence S 49° E to the S. E. cor. of the Dan Easley Labor, thence N 41° E 510 vrs to the N. W. cor. of the of the John Saddler survey, thence S 49° E 60 varas to the corner of 70 acres of the J. L. Walker survey owned by Temple Lumber Co. thence N 86° E 1258 vrs to the E. Cor. of said 70 acres. Thence N 41° E 60 vrs to the most easterly corner of the said J. L. Walker survey. Thence N 48° W 850 vrs to another Cor said Walker survey. Thence S 70° W to the S W Cor. Sec. 33, T & N O RY CO. Thence N 2223 vrs to the N. W. cor. said Sec. 33 Thence S 69° W with south line J. A. Curry lg. to the S. E. Cor. of 318 acres owned by Gilmer Est. Thence N 49° W 870 vrs to N. E. cor. said 318 acres Thence S 69° W with N. line said 318 acres to S E cor. of 104 acres owned by J. H. Ragan in the Curry lg. Thence N 200 vrs to N. E. cor. same, thence N 72° west 1105 vrs to N. cor of said 104 acres. Thence S 33 1/2° west 1475 vrs to west corner of said 104 acres. Thence with the N. line of said Gilmer 318 acres to its N W cor. on N. E. Line of Jas. McKim lg. Thence N 49° west with N. E. line McKim league to the place of beginning.

Fourth. That the above described territory is situated wholly within Sabine county, Texas, and does not overlap or embrace any part of a political sub-division or defined road district that has been heretofore established and issued road bonds which are now outstanding and unpaid.
