

April 25th. 1921.

The Honorable Commissioners Court met in pursuance of adjourned order of April 20th. 1921 A. D.

With the following members present, as follows, to-wit:

W. C. Arnold County Judge
S. W. Bright County Clerk

The court was opened by proclamation of the Sheriff.

The following matters together with others were had to-wit:

It is ordered that the available school fund be reimbursed out of the Road & Bridge fund to the amount of \$138.95, account error by placing the interest on daily balances available school fund in said road & bridge fund for 1920.

It is ordered by the court that the order passed on April 20th relative to cleaning out culverts in town of Hemphill that inasmuch as said convicts mentioned therein failed

to comply with their agreement that same be rescinded in so far as said Tom Ford and S. Lee convicts are concerned, and that same now apply to Murph Flanaken a convict and be in full force and effect and conditioned that work of cleaning out be entirely acceptable to said W. C. Arnold, County Judge.

It is ordered by the Court that J. H. Travis, tax Assessor, be allowed \$100.00 on account.

At a meeting of the commissioners court of the County of Sabine, Texas, held on the 25th day of April 1921, came on to be considered the returns of an election held on the 23rd day of April 1921 to determine whether or not the bonds of road district No. 3, of Sabine County, Texas, should be issued to the amount of \$100,000.00 bearing interest at the rate of 5% per cent per annum, payable 30 years from date, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes or in aid thereof and whether or not a tax shall be annually levied, assessed, and collected in said road district No. 3, of Sabine county, Texas, sufficient to pay the current interest on said Bonds and to provide the required sinking fund to redeem them at maturity and it appearing that said election was in all respects lawfully held and said returns duly and legally made, and that there were cast at said election 119 votes of which number 98 votes were cast "For issuance of Bonds and levying of the tax in payment thereof" and 21 votes cast "Against the issuance of Bonds and levying of the tax in payment thereof".

It is therefore ordered and declared that the proposition to issue said bonds and levy said tax was sustained by a two thirds majority of the qualified property tax paying voters at said election, and that the commissioners court of the said county is authorized to issue said bonds and to levy and have assessed and collected said tax.

At a meeting of the Commissioners Court of the County of Sabine, Texas, held on the 25th day of April 1921, came on to be considered the returns of an election held on the 23rd day of April 1921 to determine whether or not the bonds of road district No. 1, of Sabine County, Texas, should be issued to the amount of \$70,000.00, bearing interest at the rate of 5% per cent per annum payable 30 years from date, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes or in aid thereof, and whether or not a tax shall be annually levied, assessed and collected in said road district No. 1, of Sabine county, Texas, sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and to provide the required sinking fund to redeem them at maturity and it appearing that said election was in all respects lawfully held and said returns duly and legally made, and that there were cast at said election 34 votes, of which number 33 votes were cast "For the issuance of Bonds and levying of the Tax in payment thereof", and 1 vote cast "Against the issuance of Bonds and levying of the tax in payment thereof".

It is therefore ordered and declared that the proposition to issue said bonds and levy said tax was sustained by a two thirds majority of the qualified property tax payers voting at said election, and that the commissioners court of the said county is authorized to issue said bonds and to levy and have assessed and collected said tax.
