

ORDER OF COMMISSIONERS COURT ESTABLISHING ROAD DISTRICT

NO. 9, OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS.

The State of Texas,

County of Sabine. On this the 12th day of May, A. D., 1921, the County Commissioners Court convened in regular session, at the regular meeting place thereof in the courthouse at Hemphill Texas, all the members of said Court, to-wit:

W. C. Arnold, County Judge.

J. A. Ragan, Commissioner of Precinct No. 1.

Jerry Ball, Commissioner of Precinct No. 2.

S. H. Hall, Commissioner of Precinct No. 3.

A. T. Matthews, Commissioner of Precinct No. 4, being present, and passed the following order.

WHEREAS, a petition signed by R. W. Carroll and 42 other persons, has this day been presented to this Court, praying that bonds be issued in the sum of \$20,000.00 for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, within the territory therein defined and which said petitioners pray this Court to create as a road district, to be known and designated as "Road District No. 9, of Sabine County, County, Texas.

IT APPEARING to the Court that said petition bears the requisite number of signatures of resident property taxpaying voters within the proposed road district; and,

IT FURTHER APPEARING to the Court that it is desirable to establish said road district; and,

IT FURTHER APPEARING to the Court that the boundaries of said proposed district as described and defined in said petition do not overlap or embrace any part of a political subdivision or defined road district that has heretofore been established and issued road bonds which are now outstanding and unpaid; and,

IT FURTHER APPEARING to the Court that all the territory to be included within said proposed district is wholly within Sabine County, Texas;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Commissioner Court of Sabine County, Texas:

1.

That Road District No. 9, of Sabine County, in the State of Texas, be, and the same is hereby established within the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning in said Sabine County, Texas, at the most northern cor. of the Mary J. Brumley Survey.

Thence S. 58 E. with the N. E. line of the M. J. Brumley survey to its N.E. corner.

Thence S. 5 E. with M. J. Brumley's East line to its E. E. corner.

Thence S. 32 W. with the S. E. line of the M. J. Brumley to its most southerly corner.

Thence S. 58 E. with the N. line of the H. S. White 120 vrs. to its N.E. Cor.

Thence S. 32 W. with the S. E. line of the H. S. White survey to its most southerly corner on the N. line of the Robert H. Smith survey.

Thence S. 15 W. about 300 vrs. to the N. E. corner of a 120 acre subdivision owned by W. R. Davidson.

Thence N. 75 W. with W. R. Davidson's N. line to the N.W. corner of Davidsen's 120 acre subdivision.

Thence S. 5 E. 189 vrs. with the W. B. line of said W. R. Davidsen's 120

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acre subdivision to the N. line of a 100 acre subdivision of said Robert H. Smith owned by W. R. Davidson.

Thence S. 83 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. with the N. line of the W. R. Davidson 100 acre subdivision to the E. line of the John Clark League.

Thence S. 5 E. with John Clark's East league line to the Housen Bayou.

Thence in a westerly direction with the Housen Bayou to the mouth of Watts Creek.

Thence in a westerly direction up the Watts Creek with its meanders to the west line of a 200 acre subdivision owned by H. W. Huffman.

Thence N. 6 W. with the West line of said 200 acre subdivision to the S. E. corner of a 100 acre subdivision owned by T. G. Fuller, same being the N. E. corner of the J. A. Travis 100 acres.

Thence west with the N. line of J. A. Travis 100 acres 674 vrs. to the S. E. corner of a 10 acre subdivision owned by J. A. Travis.

Thence N. 6 W. with the East line of said 10 acre subdivision 155 vrs. to its N.E. corner.

Thence west with the N. line of said J. A. Travis 10 acres 360 vrs. to its N. W. corner on the divisional line of the John Clark League.

Thence S. 6 E. with the divisional line of the John Clark League to Watts Creek.

Thence in a westerly direction up Watts Creek with its meanders to the west line of the John Clark League same being the east line of the John Gilbert League.

Thence S. 5 E. with the East line of the John Gilbert League to the N. E. corner of a subdivision on the John Gilbert League known as Block No. 6.

Thence S. 85 W. with the N. line of Block No. 6, Block No. 5, and Block No. 4, to the N. W. corner of Block No. 4.

Thence S. 5 E. with the west line of Block No. 4, to the N. E. corner of the B. V. Jones 151 acre subdivision.

Thence S. 85 W. with B. V. Jones N. line to the N. W. corner, of said B. V. Jones, 151 acre subdivision.

Thence S. 5 E. with the W. line of the B. V. Jones 151 acres 102 vrs to the N.E. corner of the W. T. Jones 100 acre subdivision.

Thence S. 85 W. with the N. line of the W. T. Jones 100 acres and the N. line of the W. T. Jones 22 acre subdivision and the N. line of the C. M. Whitehead 140 acre subdivision to the N. W. corner of the C. M. Whitehead 140 acre subdivision of the John Gilbert League.

Thence North 36 W. 2100 vrs. to the S. W. corner of the Elijah Clark survey.

Thence N. 5 W. with the West line of the Elijah Clark survey to its N. W. corner.

Thence S. 85 W. with the N. line of the John Gilbert to the S. W. corner of the J.T. Carlton survey.

Thence N. 9 E. with J. T. Carlton's W. B. line to the S. W. corner of T. & N. O. Ry Co. survey, Section 10.

Thence N. 9 E. with the west line of T. & N. O. Ry Co. Sec. 10, to its N. W. corner.

Thence N. 9 E. with the west line of T. & N. O. Ry Co. Sec. 9, to its N. W. corner.

Thence N. 9 E. with the west boundary line of T. & N. O. Ry Co. Sec. 8 to the S. line of the J. E. Ellison survey.

Thence N. 65 E. with the S. line of the J. E. Ellison survey to its S. E. corner.

Thence N. 25 W. with the East line of the J. E. Ellison survey to its N. E. corner on the S. B. line of the William Isaacs League.

Thence N. 64 E. with the S. B. line of the William Isaacs survey to the most northwesterly corner of T. & N. O. Ry Co. Sec. 8 same being the most western corner of the Joseph

Mott League.

Thence S. 34 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. with the west line of the Joseph Mott League to its S. W. corner on the N. line of the William Donahoe Survey.

Thence S. 81 E. with the S. line of the Joseph Mott League to the Joseph Motts S. E. corner on the W. B. line of the William Clark lge.

Thence N. with the west boundary line of the William Clark League 705 vrs. to the Gum bottom creek.

Thence in an easterly direction with the meanders of Gum bottom creek to the E.B. line of 138 $\frac{1}{2}$ acre subdivision formerly owned by the South Western Settlement and Development Company.

Thence S. with the E. B. line of said 138 $\frac{1}{2}$ acre subdivision to the N.W. corner of a 63 acre tract owned by Hiram Knox.

Thence East with the N. line of said Knox 63 acre subdivision 339 vrs. to its N. E. corner on the W. B. line of another 63 acre subdivision owned by Hiram Knox.

Thence N. with the W. B. line of said Knox 63 acres to its N.W. corner.

Thence East with the N. line of said Knox 63 acre subdivision 287 vrs. to the W. B. line of a 100 acre subdivision owned by Hiram Knox.

Thence N. with the W. B. line of said Knox 100 acres 497 vrs. to its N.W. corner.

Thence East with the N. line of said Knox 100 acres 411 vrs. to its N.E. corner.

Thence S. with the east boundary line of said Knox 100 acres 1091 vrs to its S. E. corner on the S. E. line of the William Clark League same being the W. B. line of the Wright Coley survey.

Thence S. 36 W. with the Wright Coley's W. B. line to its S. W. corner.

Thence East with the S. B. line of the Wright Coley Survey 1300 vrs.

Thence S. 250 vrs. to the most northerly corner of the M. J. Brumley survey, the place of beginning, and being the same description of said territory as given in said petition.

That said Road District No. 9, of Sabine County, Texas, is hereby established for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof; within and for said district, under and by virtue of the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, including Chapter 2, Title 18, Revised Statutes, 1911, as amended by Chapter 203, Acts of 1917, Regular Session, and Chapter 18, Acts Fourth called Session of the Thirty-fifth Legislature and the said district is hereby made and created a body corporate.

It is further ordered by the Court that if the proposition to issue \$20,000.00 road bonds as prayed for in said petition does not receive a two-thirds majority of the vote cast at the election to be ordered by this Court for the purpose of determining whether or not said bonds shall be issued by said district, then this order shall become wholly null and void, but if said proposition shall receive such necessary favorable vote this order shall then remain in full force and effect while said bonds, or any of them, are outstanding obligations of said road district.
