

The Honorable Commissioners Court met in special session July 18, 1921, A.D. with the following members present:

The court was opened by proclamation of the Sheriff, G. W. Alford.

It is ordered by the court that the Tax Assessor is hereby directed to levy a maintenance local tax of fifty cents on the \$100.00 valuation in Pine Grove Common School dist. #2, and that same is hereby ordered for and beginning the year 1921.

After discussing the question of putting down a deep well for Court House and Jail and sewer system it was decided to indefinitely postpone taking action toward providing any kind of system more than we now have unless it becomes absolutely necessary to take further action in order to take care of same.

It is ordered by the court that all county convicts be reinstated on the street, roads, highways or to be hired out under contract under the following system, viz:

That they shall be under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner in whose beat they are being worked; said commissioner shall act as guard as well as road supervisor and shall at all times take him from the jail in due time begin work promptly at 7 o'clock and if too far to return to jail at noon have take their dinner with them, in other words said convicts shall have the ground ready to begin work promptly at 7 o'clock and there remain until 6 o'clock P.M. unless unavoidable hindered, thus doing away with a way with the service of a regular guard and also an extra man on the truck.

Adjourned Session July 23rd, 1921.

In accordance with request from the Federal and State Highway engineer court met by appointment in adjourned session for the purpose of going over the Hemphill-Geneva highway for final inspection and approval of same and it was found that there were some minor objections made by said Department to be met by the county in order to meet the State's approval said objections to be fully set out in a letter from the Highway Department immediately upon their return to Austin, pointing out to the court just what had to be done by the County forces in order to meet the approval of said Department.

It is further ordered that the services of the court house janitor be dispensed with same to become effective on Monday, July 25th, 1921.
