The resignation of Mr. Johnson County Agent, by request through W.C. Arnold having been tendered same is hereby accepted by the court.

Court met in regular monthly session Sept. 12, 1921.

It is ordered by the court that the County help extended to Jake Woodard be increased from \$10.00 to \$15.00 per months, same to take effect from Sept. 1st, 1921.

It is ordered by the Court that O.F. Lynch be paid at the rate of \$2.49 per foot for well 38 feet deep, or \$94.62 for well put down on court house square in town of Hemphill.

The matter of salary to be paid for live stock inspector for Sabine County, having come up said salary to be terminated at any time at discretion of it, a vote was taken as follows:

For \$75.00 per month as salary (S.H. Hall)
(A.T. Mathews)

It is therefore ordered that an inspector be paid \$75.00 per month.

The return of a special election held at Geneva, held on the 3rd day of Sept. 1921, for the purpose of determining whether or not the bonds of Geneva Independent School Dist. shall be issued to the amount of 4500.00 payable 20 yrs. from date bearing 6% int. having been canvassed and the returns showing as follows:

For the bond and the tax 33 votes, against the bonds and the tax 42 votes.
