County of Sabine. | On this the 11th day of Sept., 1922, the commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas, convened in regular session, at the regular meeting place thereof in the courthouse at Hemphill, Texas, all members of the Court to-wit:

S. H. Hall, Commissioner of Precinct No. 3.
A. T. Matthews, Commissioner of Precinct No. 4, being present, came on

to be considered the petition of I. C. Busby and 4 other persons, praying that bonds be issued by said Road District No. 7, of Sabine County, Texas, in the sum of \$15,000.00, bearing five and one half per cent rate of interest, maturing at such times as may be fixed by the Commissioners Court, serial or otherwise, not to exceed thirty years from date thereof, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, gravelled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, and whether or not a tax shall be levied upon the property of said Road District No. 7, of Sabine County, Texas, subject to taxation, for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity; and,

It appearing to the Court that said petition is signed by a majority of the resident property taxpaying voters of said Road District No. 7, of Sabine County, Texas; and

It further appearing that the amount of bonds to be issued will not exceed one-fourth of the assessed valuation of the real property of said Road District No. 7, of Sabine County, Texas; and,

It further appearing that said Road District No. 7, of Sabine County, Texas, has been duly established by an order of the Commissioners Court of Sabine, dated the 12th day of May, 1921, of record in Book "L" pages _____ of the Minutes of said Court, and the boundaries thereof are herein described as described and defined in the order of the Commissioners Court establishing such district, as follows, to-wit:

Beginning in said Sabine County, Texas, at a point on the S. boundary line of the G. L. Bourland League where said S. line crosses the Housen Bayou.

Thence S. 64 W. with the S. line of the G. L. Bourland League to the N.W. corner of the J. S. Chival survey.

Thence S. 25 E. with the W. B. line of the J. S. Chival survey to its S.W. corner, same being on the East line of the W. G. Edgar pre-emption.

Thence S. 25 E. with the East boundary line of the W. G. Edgar pre-emption to its S. E. corner.

Thence S. 66 W. with the S. line of the W. G. Edgar Pre-emption to the N.E. corner of the A. C. Ball Pre-emption.

Thence S. 24 E. with the E. line of the A. C. Ball Pre-emption to its S.E. corner.

Thence S. 66 W. with A. C. Ball's S. line to Sandy or Six mile Creek.

Thence in a northwesterly direction with the Six Mile Creek and Sandy Creek

to the N. E. corner or most northerly corner of a 239-1/2 acre tract on the Robert Russell survey owned by the Temple Lumber Company.

Thence S. 66-1/2 W. with the N. line of said 239-1/2 acre subdivision owned by the Temple Lumber Company to its N. W. corner on the west line of the Robert Russell survey.

Thence N. 27 W. with the West line of the Robert Russell survey to the S. line of the Eli Low League.

Thence N. 63 E. with the S. line of the Eli Low League to the S.W. corner of a 29-4/10 acre tract on the Eli Low owned by Burns.

Thence N. 27 W. with the W. line of said 29-4/10 acre Burns subdivision to the road leading from Hemphill to Fairdale.

Thence Northeasterly with said road to the N. E. corner of said 29-4/10 acre subdivision same being a point on the E. line of the Eli Low League.

Thence N. 27 W. with the E. line of the Eli Low League to its N.E. corner.

Thence S. 63 W. with the N. line of the Eli Low League to the most eastern corner of the William Arledge survey at a point on the S. line of the Jesse Low survey.

Thence west with the S. line of the Jesse Low survey 600 yrs. to the S.E. corner of a 322 acre subdivision owned by L. J. Conner.

Thence N. on L. J. Conners East boundary line 1760 yrs to the Housen Bayou, continuing same course along W. G. Conner's E. boundary line at 690 yrs. to the N. W. corner of Block No. 1, being a 57 1/4 acre subdivision of the Jesse Low survey owned by Temple Lbr. Co.

Thence E. along the North lines of Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, to the N.W. corner of Block No. 6, being a subdivision of 57 1/4 acres owned by W. G. Eners Sr.

Thence S. 1164 yrs. with W. G. Eners W. E. line to said W.G. Eners S. W. corner of Block No. 6.

Thence East along the S. line of Blocks No. 6; and No. 7, 554 yrs to the west boundary line of a 120 acre subdivision owned by W. P. Smith.

Thence S. 765 yrs to the S. W. cor. of said W. P. Smith 120 acres.

Thence E. with the N. line of Section 2 H.E.&W.T. Railway Company, to the N.E. corner of same on the W.E. line of the G. L. Bourland League.

Thence N. 26 W. with the W. line of said Bourland League to the S.W. corner of 26 acres once owned by W. W. McDaniel.

Thence N. 72 E. 676 yrs to the S.E. cor. of said 26 acres.

Thence N. 26 W. 220 yrs to the N. E. cor. of said 26 acres.

Thence N. 72 E. 525 yrs to the N. E. corner of the D. D. Edgar 200 acre subdivision.

Thence S. 26 East with the W. line of said Edgar 200 acres 1100 yrs to its S. W. corner.

Thence N. 72 E. with the S. line of said Edgar 200 acres 1100 yrs to its S. E. corner.

Thence N. 26 W. with the E. line of said Edgar 200 acres 499 yrs. to the S. W. cor. of the J. S. Groom 36 acres tract.

Thence N. 34 E. with the S. line of said Groom tract 750 yrs to Housen Bayou.

Thence down said Housen Bayou with its meanders in a southeasterly direction to the most southerly point of the J. S. Groom 45 acre tract.

Thence N. 16 E. 120 yrs. to another cor. of said Groom tract.

Thence N. 50 W. with the E. line of said Groom tract 700 yrs. to the S.E. cor. of the T.L. McDaniel 82 acre tract.

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Thence N. 26 W. with the E. line of said 82 acre tract 580 vrs. to its N.E. cor.
Thence S. 72 W. 1000 vrs to the N.W. cor. of said 82 acres.

Thence N. 26 W. with the E. line of the T. L. McDaniel 200 acre tract 1175 vrs
to its N. E. cor. on the divisional line of the G. L. Bourland Lge.

Thence S. 69-3/4 W. with said divisional line to the W. line of said Bourland
Lge. on Housen Bayou.

Thence N. 26 W. 2626 vrs. with the W. line of said Bourland League to its N.W. cor.

Thence N. 69 E. with the N. line of said Bourland League to the N.E. cor. of same.

Thence S. 21 E. with the W. line of the John Moore League to Sabine River.

Thence down Sabine River with its meanders in a southeasterly direction to the
S E. cor. of the N. half of said Bourland League, same being the most northerly corner
of the John S. Chiveral Survey.

Thence S. 72 W. with the divisional line of said Bourland League 955 vrs. to the
N.W. cor. of 126 acres owned by M. F. Carter.

Thence S. 22 E. 775 vrs to the S.W. corner of said Carter 126 acres.

Thence N. 72 E. 955 vrs to the S.E. cor. of said Carter 126 acres on the E. line
of said Bourland League.

Thence S. 26 E 1725 vrs to the S.E. corner of the said Bourland League.

Thence northeasterly with the line between the 262-1/2 acres owned by H. L.
Travis and the 100 acres owned by the estate of V. H. Vickers, deceased to Sabine River.

Thence southerly with the meanders of said river to the mouth of Housen Bayou.

Thence westerly with the meanders of said Housen Bayou to the S. line of the G.L.
Bourland League the place of beginning, and being the same description of said territory as
given in said petition; and

It further appearing that said district does not embrace any part of a political
subdivision or defined road district that has been heretofore established and has is-
sued bonds which are now outstanding and unpaid;

IT IS THEREFORE CONSIDERED AND ORDERED by the Court that an election be held
in said Road District No. 7, of Sabine County, Texas, on the 28th day of Oct. 1922, which
is not less than thirty days from the date of this order, to determine whether or not the
bonds of said Road District No. 7, of Sabine County, Texas, shall be issued in the amount
of \$15,000.00, bearing five and one half per cent rate of interest, and maturing at such
times as may be fixed by the Commissioners Court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed thirty
years from the date hereof; and whether or not a tax shall be levied upon the property of
said Road District No. 7, of Sabine County, Texas, subject to taxation, for the purpose of
paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption there-
of at maturity.

The said election shall be held under the provisions of Articles 627 to 641, in-
clusive, of Chapter 2, Title 18, Revised Statutes, 1911, as amended by Section 1, Chapter
203, Acts of 1917, Regular Session.

All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and of this County,
and who are resident property taxpayers in Road District No. 7, of Sabine County, Texas,
shall be entitled to vote at said election, and all voters desiring to support the propo-
sition to issue the bonds shall have written or printed on their ballots the words:

"For the issuance of bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."

And those opposed shall have written or printed on their ballots the words:

"Against the issuance of bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."

The polling place and presiding officer of said election shall be respectively
as follows:

At Old Tim Edgar house, with J. G. Busby as Presiding officer.

The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the general laws of the State of Texas, regulating general elections, when not in conflict with the provisions of the Statutes hereinabove referred to.

Notice of said election shall be given by publication of a copy of this order in the Sabine County Reporter, a newspaper published in the County of Sabine, State of Texas, for four successive weeks before the date of said election, and, in addition thereto, there shall be posted other copies of this order at three public places in Road District No. 7, of Sabine County, Texas, for three weeks prior to said election.

The County Judge is hereby directed to cause said notice to be published and posted, as hereinabove directed, and further orders are reserved until the returns of said election are made by the duly authorized election officers and received by this Court.

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PETITION TO THE COMMISSIONERS COURT FOR ROAD DISTRICT
BONDS AND FOR CREATION OF ROAD DISTRICT.

The State of Texas,)

County of Sabine.) To the Honorable Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas:

We, the undersigned, being resident citizens within the hereinafter described territory situated in Sabine County, Texas, respectfully represent:

First: That we are resident property taxpaying voters within said territory.

Second. That we desire your honorable body to order an election to determine whether or not the bonds of said territory, to be known and designated as "Road District No. 11, of Sabine County, Texas, "shall be issued in the amount of Sixty, (\$60,000.00) dollars bearing five and one half per cent rate of interest, and maturing at such times as may be fixed by the Commissioners Court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed thirty years from date thereof, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, gravelled or paved roads and turnpikes or in aid thereof; and whether or not a tax shall be levied upon the property of said proposed road district, subject to taxation, for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity.

Third. That the territory which we pray your honorable body to designate as "Road EDistrict No. 11, of Sabine County, Texas, is accurately described by metes and bound, to-wit:

Beginning in said Sabine County, Texas, where the East boundary line of the Henry Nichols League crosses Housen Bayou, this point being N. 20 W. 470 vrs. from the S.E. corner of said Henry Nichols League.

Thence N. 20 W. with said Nichols E. Line to the graded road leading from Hemphill in the direction of Fairdale.

Thence Northwesterly with the S. W. line of the right-of-way of said road to the W. line of 1126 acres owned by Temple Lumber Company.

Thence N. 20 W. to the N. E. corner of the M. J. Rice 100 acres.

Thence S. 70 W. with the S. line of 103 acres owned by J. R. Chapman's Estate.

Thence N. 32 W. to the N. E. corner of 50 acres owned by Bates Battle.

Thence N. 20 W. to the N. W. corner of said 103 acres same being the N. E. corner of the Sandy White 48 acres on the N. E. line of the Henry Nichols League.

Thence W. with the said Nichols line to said graded road leading to the town of Hemphill.

Thence Northwesterly with the S. W. line of the right-of-way of said graded

road leading to the town of Hemphill.

Thence northwesterly with the S. W. line of the right-of-way of said graded road to the E. line of the John Hailey League.

Thence N. 17 W. to the N. E. corner of said Hailey League.

Thence N. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. with the E. line of the Ben Franklin survey to the S.E. corner of the Joseph Walker survey.

Thence S. 75 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. with the S. line of said Walker survey to said graded road.

Thence Northwesterly with the S. W. line of the right-of-way of said graded road to the S. E. corner of 12 acres owned by G. E. Pratt.

Thence N. 115 yrs to the N. E. corner of said 12 acres.

Thence W. 595 yrs to the N.W. corner of said 12 acres.

Thence N. 278 yrs. to the S. W. corner of the Sherrod Emanuel Survey.

Thence E. 235 yrs to the S. E. corner of said Emanuel tract.

Thence N. 240 yrs. to the N. E. corner of said Emanuel tract.

Thence E. 386 yrs. to the S. E. corner of the Fuller Subdivision.

Thence N. with the E. line of the Fuller subdivision to the public road leading from Hemphill to Milan.

Thence in a northeasterly direction with said Hemphill and Milan public road to the S. B. line of the Jno. S. Lane League.

Thence N. 78 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. with the Jno. S. Lanes S. B. line to the S. W. corner of a subdivision of said league owned by W. R. Pickering Lumber Co.

Thence N. 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. with the W. line of the tract of land owned by the Pickering Lumber Company to its N. W. corner on Polo Gochs Creek.

Thence northwesterly with the meanderings of said Polo Gochs Creek to the E. line of the William Clark League.

Thence S. with the E. line of said Clark League to Tebo Creek.

Thence Northwesterly with the meanderings of said Tebo creek to the N.E. corner of 30 acres owned by L. H. Chandler.

Thence S. with the E. line of said Chandler 30 acres and the E. line of 1383 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres formerly owned by the Houston Oil Company to the N. W. corner of 63 acres owned by H. Knox.

Thence E. 339 $\frac{1}{2}$ yrs to the N. E. corner of said 63 acres.

Thence N. 220 yrs to the N. W. corner of another 63 acre tract owned by H. Knox.

Thence E. 287 yrs to the N. E. corner of said 63 acres.

Thence N. 497 yrs to the N. W. corner of 100 acres owned by H. Knox.

Thence E. 411 yrs to the N. E. corner of said 100 acres.

Thence S. 1091 yrs to the S. E. cor. of said 100 acres on the S.E. line of said William Clark survey.

Thence S. 36 W. to the S.W. cor. of the Wright Coley survey.

Thence E. with the E. line of said Coley Survey 1300 yrs. M. J. Brumley survey.

Thence S. 58 E. with the N. E. line of the M. J. Brumley survey, to its N.E. corner.

Thence S. 5 E. with M. J. Brumley's East line to its S. E. corner.

Thence S. 32 W. with the S. E. line of the M. J. Brumley to its most southern corner.

Thence S. 58 E. with the N. line of the H. S. White 120 yrs. to its N.E. corner.

Thence S. 32 W. with the S. E. line of the H. S. White survey to its most southerly corner on the N. line of the Robert H. Smith survey.

Thence S. 15 W. about 300 vrs to the N. E. corner of a 120 acre subdivision owned by W. R. Davidson.

Thence N. 75 W. with W. R. Davidsons N. line to the N. W. corner of Davidsons 120 acre subdivision.

Thence S. 5 E. 189 vrs. with the W. B. line of said W.R. Davidson 120 acre subdivision to the N. line of a 100 acre subdivision of said Robert H. Smith owned by W.R. Davidson.

Thence S. 83-3/4 W. with the N. line of W. R. Davidson 100 acre subdivision to the E. line of the John Clark League.

Thence S. 5 E. with John Clark's East Line to the Housen Bayou.

Thence in a westerly direction with the Housen Bayou to the mouth of Watts Creek.

Thence S. 58 E. with the N. line of the C. M. Easley survey to its N.E. corner.

Thence S. 32 W. with the W. line of the John Sadler survey to the S.W. corner of 8 1/2 acres owned by G. M. Tatom.

Thence S. 58 E. 255 vrs. to the S. E. corner of said 8 1/2 acres.

Thence N. 32 E. 183 vrs. to the N. E. corner of said 8 1/2 acres.

Thence S. 58 E. along the N. B. line of the portion of Saddler owned by the Houston Oil Company to the S. E. corner. of 40 acres owned by W. F. Conner on the E. line of the Saddler survey.

Thence N. 32 E. to the N. E. corner of said Saddler survey on the S.B. line of the Isaac F. Pace survey.

Thence S. 58 E. to the S. E. corner of said Pace survey.

Thence N. 32 E. with the E. line of said Pace survey to its N.E. corner on the S.B. line of the Sion Smith League.

Thence S. 58 E. along the S. line of the Sion Smith League to the S.W. cor. of a 223 acre tract on said Sion Smith league owned by the W.R. Pickering Lumber Company.

Thence N. 23 E. with the W. line of said W. R. Pickering Lumber Company 223 acre tract to its N. W. cor. being the S. W. cor. of a 224 acre subdivision of said Sion Smith League heretofore owned by J. C. Travis and wife.

Thence S. 58 E. along the S. line of said 224 acre Travis subdivision to its S. E. cor. on the W. line of J. S. Fuller's 293 1/2 acre tract.

Thence N. 30 E. with the J. S. Fullers W. line to the S. bank of Housen Bayou.

Thence easterly down the Housen Bayou with its meanders to the E. line of the Henry Nichols League the place of beginning.

Fourth. That the above described territory is situated wholly within Sabine County, Texas, and does not overlap or embrace any part of a political subdivision or defined road district that has heretofore been established and issued road bonds which are now outstanding and unpaid.
