The General Election returns have been canvassed and the following Name here in an declared elected. It is ordered by the Court that the presiding officers Clerk & Judges be paid \$3.00 per day for Holding Gen Election 30 cents per hour for over time of 10 hrs. or more that the office that being in returns be allowed 2.00 for their services.

Canvassing Returns and Declaring Result of Election.

At a meeting of the Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas held on the 10th day of November 1922, came on to be considered the returns of an election held on the 28th day of October 1922, to determine whether or not the bonds of Road District No. 11, of Sabine County, Texas, should be issued to the amount of \$60,000.00 bearing interest at the rate of five and one-half per cent per annum, payable thirty years from date, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, and whether or not a tax shall be annually levied, assessed and collected in Road District No. 11, of Sabine County, Texas, sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and to provide the required sinking fund to redeem them at maturity, and it appearing that said election was in all respects lawfully held, and said returns duly and legally made, and that there were cast at said election 143 votes, of which number 53 votes were cast, "For the issuance of bonds and levying of the tax in payment thereof" and 90 votes "Against the issuance of bonds and levying of the tax in payment thereof."

It is therefore ordered and declared that the proposition to issue said bonds and levy said tax was not sustained by a twethirds majority of the qualified property taxpayers voting at said election and that said proposition is lost and not carried.

Canvassing Returns and Declaring Result of Election.

At a meeting of the Commissioners Court of the County of Sabine, State of Texas, held on the 10th day of November 1922, came on to be considered the returns of an election held on the 28th day of October 1922, to determine whether or not the bonds of Road District No. 7, of Sabine County, Texas, should be issued to the amount of \$15,000.00, bearing interest at the rate of five and one-half per cent, per annum, payable thirty years from date, for the purpose of constructing maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof and whether or not a tax shall be annually levied, assessed and collected, in said Road District No. 7, of Sabine County, Texas, sufficient to pay the current interest them at maturity, and it appearing that said election was in all respects lawfully held, and said return duly and legally made, and that there were cast at said election 5 votes, of which number 5 votes were cast "For the issuance of bonds and levying of the ~~tax~~ tax in payment thereof." and) votes cast "Against the issuance of bonds and levying of the tax in payment thereof."

It is therefore ordered and declared that the proposition to issue said bonds and levy said tax was sustained by a two-thirds majority of the qualified property tax-payers voting at said election, and that the Commissioners Court of the said County is authorized to issue said bonds, and to levy and have assessed and collected said tax.

Canvassing Returns and Declaring Result of Election.

At a meeting of the Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas, held on the 10th day of November, 1922, came on to be considered the returns of an election held on the 28th day of October 1922, to determine whether or not the bonds of Road District No. 9, of Sabine County, Texas, should be issued to the amount of \$20,000.00 bearing interest at the rate of five and one-half per cent per annum, payable thirty years from date, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, and whether or not a tax shall be annually levied, assessed and collected in said Road District No. 9, of Sabine County, Texas, sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and to provide the required sinking fund to redeem them at maturity, and it appearing that said election was in all respects lawfully held, and said returns duly and legally made, and that there were cast at said election 60 votes, of

which number 48 votes were cast, "For the issuance of bonds and levying of the tax in payment thereof," and 12 votes "Against the issuance of bonds and levying of the tax in payment thereof."

It is therefore ordered and declared that the proposition to issue said bonds and levy said tax was sustained by a two thirds majority of the qualified property tax-payers voting at said election, and that the Commissioners Court of the said County is authorized to issue said bonds, and to levy and have assessed and collected said tax.

PETITION TO THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT FOR
ROAD DISTRICT BONDS AND FOR CREATION OF ROAD DISTRICT.

The State of Texas,
County of Sabine.

To the Honorable Commissioners' Court of Sabine County, Texas:

We, the undersigned, being resident citizens within the hereinafter described territory situated in Sabine County, Texas, respectfully represent.

First. That we are resident property taxpaying voters within said territory.

Second. That we desire your Honorable body to order an election to determine whether or not the bonds of said territory, to be known and designated as "Road District"

No. 10, of Sabine County, Texas." shall be issued in the amount of Ninety Thousand Dollars bearing five per cent rate of interest, and maturing at such times as may be fixed by the Commissioners' Court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed thirty years from date thereof, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, gravelled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof; and whether or not a tax shall be levied upon the property of said proposed road district, subject to taxation, for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity.

The proceeds of said bonds to be used in the following manner:

(1) \$12,000 on that part of the road running East and West through the town of Brookeland which lies within said district.

(2) \$3000.00 on that portion of the Hemphill and Tebo road lying within said district.

(3) 5000.00 on that part of the road running East and West through Bronson which lies within said district.

(4) \$3000.00 on that portion of the road running East and West through the town of Pineland which lies within said district.

(5) \$67,000.00 on the public road leading from the County line of Sabine County just West of the town of Tebo by way of Tebo, Bronson, Pineland and Brookeland to the County line of Jasper County.

Third. That the territory which we pray your Honorable body to designate as "Road District No. 10, of Sabine County, Texas," is accurately described by metes and bounds to-wit:

Beginning at the Southwest corner of Sabine County, where said County corners with San Augustine County. Thence Northerly with the west line of Sabine County and the East line of San Augustine County to a point where said line crosses the Pologocho Creek. Thence Southeasterly with the meanders of the Pologocho Creek to the S. line of the N. Mackey League. Thence in a westerly direction with N. Mackey's South boundary line and the North line of L. W. Warren Survey to the Northeast corner of the Nathaniel Hamilton Survey. Thence Southerly with Nathaniel Hamilton's E. B. line to its S. E. corner on the North line of the Joseph Mott League. Thence South easterly with the North line of the Joseph Mott survey to its N. E. corner. Thence Southerly with the East line of the Joseph Mott survey to its South east corner. Thence in a Westerly direction with the South line of the Joseph Mott survey to its South western corner. Thence North Westerly with the line of the Joseph Mott, survey to its Most Westerly with the South line of the William Isaacs survey to the N.E. corner of the J. E. Ellison survey. Thence S. 25 E. with the E. line of the J. E. Ellison survey to its S. E. corner. Thence S. 65 W. with the S. line of the J. E. Ellison to the N. E. corner of T. & N. O. R. R. Co. Section 5. Thence S. 9 W. with the E. line of T. & N. O. R. R. Co. Section 5, to the S. E. corner of same and the N. E. corner of T. & N. O. R. R. Co, Survey No. 6, Thence S. 9 W. with the E. line of T. & N. O. R. R. Co, Survey No. 6, to the N. E. corner of T. & N. O. R. R. Co, Survey No. 7, Thence S. 9 W. with the E. line of T. & N. O. R. R. Co, Survey No. 7, to the North line of the John Gilbert League. Thence N. 85 E. with the North line of the John Gilbert League to the N. W. corner of the Elijah Clark 1/4 League. Thence S. 5 E. with the West boundary line of the Elijah Clark 1/4 League survey, to its S. W. corner. Thence S. 36 E. 2100 yds. to the N. W. corner of the C. M. Whitehead 140 acre subdivision of the John Gilbert League. Thence N. 85 E. with the N. line of the C. M. Whitehead 140 acre subdivision and the N. line of the W. R. Jones 22 acre Subdivision and the N. line of the W. T. Jones 100 acre subdivision of the John Gilbert League to

the W. line of the B. V. Jones 151 acre Subdivision on said John Gilbert League. Thence 5 W. with the W. line of the B. V. Jones 151 acre Subdivision to its N. W. corner. Thence S. 85 E. with the N. line of the B. V. Jones 151 acre subdivision to its N. E. corner on the West line of Block No. 4. Thence North 5 W. with the West line of Block No. 4, to the N. W. corner of Block No. 4. Thence N. 85 E. with the N. line of Block No. 4, Block No. 5 and Block No. 6, to the N. E. corner of Block No. 6, on the E. B. line of the John Gilbert League. Thence N. 5 W. with the E. B. Line of the John Gilbert League to Watts' creek. Thence down Watts' Creek in an easterly direction to the divisional line of the John Clark League. Thence S. 6 E. with the Divisional line of the John Clark League to the N. W. corner of a 90 acre Subdivision on said League owned by the Temple Lumber Company. Thence N. 85 E. with the N. line of said Temple Lumber Company 90 acre subdivision to the N. W. corner of a 90 acre Subdivision on said John Clark league owned by J. H. Travis. Thence S. 4 1/2 E. with the W. line of said J. H. Travis 9 acre Subdivision to its S. W. corner. Thence N. 85 E. with the S. line of said J. H. Travis 9 acre subdivision to its S. E. corner on the E. B. line of the John Clark League. Thence S. 5 E. with the E. B. line of the John Clark League to its Most South eastern corner, at the N. E. corner of the C. M. Easley survey. Thence S. 32 W. with the E. B. line of the C. M. Easley Survey to the N. line of the C. W. Easley Survey. Thence S. 58 E. with the N. line of the C. M. Easley survey to its N. E. corner. Thence S. 32 W with the W. line of the Joh Saddler survey. to the N. line of the John Moore League. Thence N. 55 W. with John Moore's N. Boundary line to the N. W. corner of said John Moore League. Thence S. 35 W. with John Moore's West league line to the N. W. corner of an 8 acre tract owned by Frank Martin. Thence S. 55 E. with the N. line of said Martin 8 acre tract to its N. E. corner. Thence S. 35 W. with the E. line of said Martin 8 acre tract to its S. E. corner on the South line of the John Moore League. Thence S. 55 E. on John Moore's League line to the N. E. corner of the Daniel Estep. Thence S. 37 W. with Daniel Estep's E. line to his S. E. corner. Thence N. 55 W. with Daniel Estep's S. Boundary line to the N. E. corner of the Martin-Whitehead survey. Thence S. 55 W. with Martin Whitehead's E. boundary line to the S. W. corner of T. & N. O. R. R. Co. Survey Section 38. Thence S. 55 E with the South line of T. & N. O. R. R. Co. Survey 38, to the N. E. corner of a 12 acre tract on T. & N. O. R. R. Co. Section No. 37. Thence S. 49 W. with the E. line of the said J. F. Whitehead 12 acre Subdivision to the W. line of T. & N. O. R. R. Co. Section No. 37. Thence S. 14 W. with the west line of T. & N. O. R. R. Co. Section No. 37 to its S. W. corner. Thence N. 69 E. with the S. line of Section 37 T. & N. O. R. R. Co Survey to the East corner of a 66 acre Subdivision on the J. A. Curry League owned by the Kirby Lumber Company. Thence S. 42 W. with the East line of said Kirby Lumber Company's 66 acre tract to the most northerly corner of the James McKim League. Thence S. 41 West with McKim's west line to the Southwest corner of said League. Thence S. 49 E. with the S. line of said McKim League 512 yrs. to the N. E. corner of the A. E. C. Johnson League, where said conflicts with the S. Nelson 1/4 League. Thence S. with the original east line of said A. E. C. Johnson League to its S. E. corner on the Bank of McKim Creek. Thence up said McKim Creek with its meanders to the East line of the M. Cummings League on the W. B. line of the F. Berryman Survey. Thence S. 42 W. with the E. B. line of the M. Cummings Survey to the S. W. corner of the F. Berryman Survey. Thence S. 49 E. with the S. Line of the F. Berryman Survey to its S. E. corner. Thence N. 42 E. with the E. line of the F. Berryman survey 100 yrs, to the S. W. corner of a 27 acre Subdivision of Section 240 H. & T. C. R. R. Co owned by W. W. Berryman. Thence S. 48 E. with the S. line of the W. W. Berryman 27 acre subdivision to its S. E. corner. Thence N. 42 E. with the E. line of the W. W. Berryman 27 acre subdivision to its N. E. corner on the S. B. Line of the E. W. Hocket Survey. Thence S. 48 E. to the S. B. line of the E. W. Hocket survey 556 yrs to its S. E. corner. Thence N. 42 E. with E. W. Hocket

Fourth. That the above described territory is situated wholly within Sabine County, Texas, and does not overlap or embrace any part of a political subdivision or defined Road District that has heretofore been established and issued Road Bonds which are now outstanding and unpaid.
