

The Hon. Commissioners Court conveyed in Regular Session on April the 9th 1923, with the following officers present;

W. H. Davidson, County Judge.

J. H. Ener, County Clerk.

E. W. Nation, Sheriff

J. A. Ragan, Commissioner Precinct No. 1.

J. M. Ball, Commissioner Precinct No. 2.

S. H. Hall, Commissioner Precinct No. 3.

A. F. Vickers, Commissioner Precinct No. 4.

C. H. Vickers presented to the Court his written petition asking the court to release him off of the Bond of R. W. Baldree, Constable of Constable Precinct No. 1. The Court accepted the application and released C. H. Vickers from said Bond.

C. E. Cooper was appointed by the Court as Justice of the Peace Precinct No. 2. to succeed J. L. Fin, who has resigned from the position.

R. W. Baldree presented a new bond as constable Precinct No. 1. And the same was approved.

The Court ordered that all officers of elections in Road Bond Districts be paid, the amount that the law requires to be paid for holding Elections. The amount to be paid out of each Road District Funds, and if any District failed to carry the officers of that District are not entitled to any pay as the District didn't carry to have any funds to pay out off.

All the officers of Road Bonds District that has been paid out of General County Funds, the same amount to be remembered out of that certain District Funds back into the General County Funds.

The First National Bank, Hemphill, Texas being the highest bidder for County Funds (School & County) furnished bond on February 16, 1923 in the sum of sixty and one hundred fourteen thousand Dollars respectfully and said bonds being approved by the Commissioner Court on Feb. 17th, 1923 and the County bond being approved by Lon A. Smith, State Comptroller on March 24th 1923, said First National Bank is chosen as depository for Sabine County funds (School & County) and said bank is to pay 3 per cent on daily balances, said bank is chosen for a period of two years from February 16th, 1923.

The Court Ordered to pay P. H. Browning \$50.00 on J. C. Spights contract of furnishing material and constructing of tank and derrick in Court yard and connecting same with Court house and Jail.

By order the Court C. B. Davidson is to receive \$4.00 per day from April 1st, 1923 for transferring hands on King's Highway.
