

The Hon Comm. Court reconvene in regular session this the 15th day of Aug. 1923, with all members present.

After canvassing the returns of stock law election held at Ruddell School house in Sabine County Texas on July 28th 1923.

The court finds 43 votes cast at said election of which number there were cast for Stock law 31 votes and against Stock law 12 votes.

Majority for Stock law 19 votes

The Court ordered that managers of said election be paid for holding said election.

The court ordered the County Clerk to issue warrants out of said District No 2, in the sum of \$36.50 No 5 in the sum of \$638.00 & No 6 in the sum of \$562.00 to First National Bank ( Hemphill, Texas)

The bank is to hold the warrants until the the said amount is paid with interest at the rate of 5% interest from date until paid, the warrants are banks security for the above amount of money Borrowed.

The court allowed Mrs. Will Woods of Brookeland & Albert Carter of Hemphill \$5.00 each County aid.

On this the 15th day of August A. D. 1923, the county Commissioners court convened in regular session at the regular meeting place thereof in the courthouse at Hemphill, Texas, all members of the Court to-wit:

order:

Whereas on the 11th day of June A. D. 1923, there came on to be heard the petition of W. R. Fullen and 24 other praying that an election be held for the purpose of determining whether or not hogs, sheep and goats shall hereafter be allowed run at large in said territory set out in said petition it appearing to the court that said petition was in every respect in conformity with law it was therefore ordered that the election be held in said territory on the 28th day of July, A. D. 1923, at Ruddell School House in said territory. Now whereas, said election was duly and legally held on the said 28th day of July A. D. 1923 and the result of said election was duly certified and returned to this court by the Judges and clerks thereof.

And whereas, on the 15th day of August A. D. 1923, this court considered the returns and canvassed the same, and found that there were cast at said election 13 votes of which number 31 votes were cast "For the Stock Law" and 19 votes were cast "Against the Stock Law" and this court thereupon by order duly entered declared that the proposition so submitted was sustained and adopted by a majority votes of the qualified resident property taxpayers voting at said election.

Therefore, be it ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas, that "For the Stock Law" was sustained.
