COUNTY OF SABINE.

On this the 10th day of March A.D. 1924, the County Commissioners Court of Sabine county, convened in regular session, at the regular meeting place thereof in the courthouse at Hemphill, Texas, all the members of said Court, to wit: W.H. Davidson, County Judge, J.A. Regan, Com. of Pre. No 1, J.M. Bell, Com. Pre. No 2, S.H. Hall, Com. Pre. No 3, A.P. Vickers, Com. Pre. No 4, being present, and passed the following orders: where as on the 10th day of May A.D. 1922, this Court established Road District No. 11, of Sabine county, Texas, upon the filing of a petition by L.E. King, and 72 others, and ordered an election to be held in said District to determine whether or not said District should issue bonds in the sum of Sixty Thousand Dollars for the purpose of

constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, gravelled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, within the territory therein defined and which said election was held on the 28th day of October 1922, and resulted in 53 votes being cast for the issuance of bonds and levying of the tax in payment thereof and 90 votes were cast against the issuance of bonds and levying of the tax in payment thereof, and on the 10th day of November A.D. 1922, the Commissioners Court of said County canvassed the returns of said election and declared that the proposition to issue said bonds and levy said tax was not sustained by a two thirds majority of the qualified property taxpayers voting at said election and that said proposition was lost and not carried.

It is therefore ordered by the Court that the order establishing said Road District No. 11, be and is hereby annulled, set aside and declared void.
