ORDER OF COMMISSIONERS COURT ESTABLISHING ROAD DISTRICT NO. 13, OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS.

Court convened in regular session at the regular meeting place thereof in the Courthouse at |
Hemphill, Texas, all the members of said Court to-wit:

R.C.Travis, Commissioner of Precinct No. 4, being present, and passed the following order:

WHEREAS, a petition signed by J. H. Travis and twenty seven other persons, has this day been presented to this court praying that bonds be issued in the sum of Nine Thousand (\$9000.00) Dollars for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, within the territory therein defined and which said petitioners pray this Court to create as a road district, to be known and designated as "Road District No. 13, of Sabine County, Texas," and,

IT APPEARING to the Court that said petition bears the requisite number of singatures of resident property tax paying voters within the proposed road district; and,

IT FURTHER APPEARING to the Court that it is desirable to establish said road district; and,

IT FURTHER APPEARING to the Court that the boundaries of said proposed district as described and defined in said petition do not over-lap or embrace any part of a political subdivision or defined road district that has heretofore been established and issued road bonds which are now outstanding and unpaid; and,

IT FURTHER APPEARING to the Court that all the territory to be included within said proposed district is wholly within Sabine County, Texas:

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas:

1.

That Road District No. 13, of Sabine County, in the State of Texas, be, and the same is hereby extablished within the following metes and bounds to-wit:

Beginning in Sabine County, Texas, at the most southerly corner of the Collins Buckley Survey in the W. boundary line of the Joseph Walker Headright.

Thence N. 58 W. with Buckley's S. B. line to the N.W. cor. of the M. E. Griffin 58

Thence S. 32 W. with Griffin's W. B. line and M. J. Brumley's E. B. line to M.J. Brumley's S.E. cor.in N. B. line of H. S. White Survey.

Thence S. 58 E. with H. S. White's N.B. line tohis N. E.corner.

Thence S. 32 W. with White's E. B. line and M.E. Griffin W. B. line to H. S. White's S. cor. in N. B. line of R. H. Smith's Headright.

Thence in a S.W. direction to the N.E. corner of a survey of 120 acres owned by W. R. Davidson.

Thence N. 75 W. withDavidson's N. B. line to the N.W. corner of said 120 acres.

Thence S. 5 E. about 189 vrs. to the N. B. line of 100 acres owned by W. R. Davidson.

Thence S. 83-2/4 W. with Davidson's N. B. line to the W. B. line of R. H. Smith Headright.

Thence W. 1084 vrs. to the N.W. cor. of J.A. Travis 100 acres on the E.B.line of 500 acres owned by Chapmen and Gallup.

Thence S. 6 E. with said E. B.line of 500 acres to the N.W. corner of 90 acres owned by Temple Lumber Company.

Thence N. 852 E. 614 vrs. to the N.W.cor. of 9 acres owned by J. H. Travis.

Thence S. 5 B. 410 vrs. to the S.W. cor. of said 9 acres.

Thence N. 851 B. 124 vrs. to the S.E. corner of 9 acres in the E.B. line Jnc.Clark, and the W.B. line of the Isaac F. Pace Survey.

Thence B. 15 W. with the West line of the town of East Mayfield to its N.W. corner.

Thence N. 75 E. with the N. line of the town of East Mayfield to the W. B. line of the Joseph Walker Survey.

Thence N. 15 W. with the W. B. line of the Joseph Walker, Survey to the most Southerly normer of the Collins Buckley Survey, the place of beginning, and being the same description of said territory as given in said petition.

That said Road District No. 13, of Sabine County Texas, isnereby established for

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purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads tumpiles, or in aid thereof, within and for said district, under and by virtue of the o stitution and laws of the State of Texas, including Chapter 2, Title 18, Revised Statutes 1911, as amended by Chapter 203, Acts of 1917, regular Session, and Chapter 18, Acts Four Called Session of the Thirty-fifth Legislature; and the said district is hereby made and created a body corporate.

it is further ordered by the Court that if the proposition to issue \$9,000.00 roads bonds as prayed for in said petition does not receive a two-thirds majority of the votes cast at the election to be ordered by this Court for the purpose of determining whether o not said bonds shell be issued by said district; then this order shall become wholly null and void; but if said proposition shall receive such necessary favorable vote this order shall then remain in full force and effect while seid bonds or anyof them are outstandi obligations of said road district.

It appearing to the Court that said petition is signed by more than a majority of the resident property taxpaying voters of seld Road District No. 13, of Sabine County

It further appearing that said Road District No. 13, of sabine County, Texas, has been duly established by an order of the Commissioners Court of Sabine County. Thence up Watts Creek to the W. B. line of a 200 acre survey owned by Huffman.

Thence N. 6 W. to the N.E. corner of the J.A. Travis 100 acre Survey.

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Thence West with the North line of said Tatom 197 acres to its N. W. corner on the W. line of the Isaac Pace Survey, same being the S.W.corner of Mrs. Ada Conner's 54 acrestant.

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Thence N. 75 E. with the N. line of the town of East Mayfield to the W. B. line of the Joseph Walker Survey.

Thence N. 15 W. with the W. B. line of the Joseph Walker Survey to the most Southerly corner of the Collins Buckley Survey, the place of beginning, and being the same description of said territory as given in said petition, and

It further appearing that said district does not embrace any part of a political subdivision or defined road district that has been heretofore established and has issued bom's which are now outstanding and unpaid;

It is therefore considered and ordered by the Court that an election be held in said Road District No. 13, of Sabine County, Texas, on the 21st day of February. A.D. 1925, which is not less than thirty days from the date of this order, to determine whether or not the bonds of said Road District No. 13, of Sabine County, Texas, shall be issued in the amount of \$9,000.00 bearing five and one-half per cent rate of interest and maturing at such times as may be fixed by the Commissioners Court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed thirty years from the date thereof; and whether or not a tax shall be levied upon the property of said Road District No. 13, of Sabine County, Texas, subject to taxation, for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity.

The said election shall be held under the provisions of Articles 627 to 641, inclusive, of Chapter 2, Title 18, Revided Statutes, 1911, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 203, Acts of 1917, Regular Session.

All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and of this County, and who are resident property tax payers in Road District No. 13, of Sabine County, Texas, shall be entitled to vote at said election, and all voters desiring to support the proposition to issue the bonds shall have written or printed on their ballots the words:

"For the issuance of bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."

And those opposed shill have written or printed on their balkots the words:

"Against the issuance of bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."

The polling places and presiding officers of said election shall be respectively as lows:

At mrs. W. C. Arnold's residence with J. H. Travis as Presiding Officer.

The manner of holding said elections shall be governed by the general ages of the Stat of Texas, regulating general elections, when not in conflict with the provisions of the Statutes hereinabove referred to.

Notice of said election shall be given by publication of a copy of this order in the Sabine County Reporter, a newspaper published in Sabine County Texas, for four successive weeks before the date of said election, and, in addition thereto, there shall be posted other copies of this order at three public places in Road District No. 13, of Sabine County Texas, for three weeks prior to said election.

The County Judge ishereby directed to cause said notices to be published and posted, as hereinabove directed, and further orders are reserved until the returns of said election are made by the duly authorized election officers and received by this court.

Ordered by the Court at its regular session Jan. 21st, 1925, that all bills for stationery mass., etc., for the various offices, court house and Jail shall be approved by the County Jurgs, of Sabine County, before making the order or purchase.

Road District No. 13, Sabine County, Texas made Jan. 21st, 1925.

Ordered by the Court that the order made by the Court on Dec. 8th, 1924 establishing Road District No. 13, Sabine County, Texas, as petitioned by Mrs. Edith Nolen and others be and is hereby rescinded.
