COUNTY OF SABINE Ordered by the Court that the Assessed Valuation on M. J. Rice and wife's 50 acres on the Henry Nichols Survey be changed from \$300.00 to \$240.00 that the same on G. M. Rice & wife's 25 acres on said survey be changed from \$150.00 to \$120.00 that A. E. Ferguson's rendition be changed from 160 acres on the Jas. McKim, Survey to 9.8 acres and the valuation be changed from \$775. to \$50.00 and the Valuation on the Bronson Ice Plant be changed from \$4,000.00 to \$2,000.00 Ordered that the Tax collector figure the reduction by the 1926 rate and issue receipts for same.

Ordered by the Court that the Tax Assessor is hereby ordered to accept payment and issue receipt for State and County taxes assessed on the tax rolls for the year 1926 with out the payment of Special Road District Taxes, it is further ordered that where tax payers do not pay the special Road District Bond Taxes, the Collector shall write across the face of the receipt in red ink, Received without prejudice of Court's right to collect Road District Bond Tax unpaid,.
