

On this the 13th day of December the Commissioner's Court Convene in regular session with all officers present.

Ordered by the court to lease the County Garage to J.R. Owens for the sum of \$6.00 per month.

Ordered by the Court to allow G.A. Bennight and T.B. Seago, \$5.00 each as County aid.

The account of Tom Gray filed Dec. 9th 1926 for damage done to Truck on road from Hemphill to Springhill by car falling through bridge on stream near Martin's Ferguson place for the sum of \$102.65. Rejected by the Court.

Ordered by the Court that the 1926 valuation of C.H. Young on stock of Merchandise be reduced from \$5000.00 to \$1500.00.

Ordered by the Court that Jno. Harper, County Treasurer transfer out of the County Road Bond Sinking Fund and place to the credit of the Jury fund as a 28-

imbursement of the amount transferred out of the Jury fund into the Road Bond sinking fund of date Jan. 8th 1923 amount of same being \$500.00.

Ordered by the Court that that the County Treasurer pay matured Road/Bond Districts and accrued interest as presented against the Road District's as far as he has funds available.

The Petition of George Meister, petition to the Court to be placed in the Geneva hog Law district was presented to the Court.

Ordered by the Court that the petition be granted and the Geneva hog law district to include the boundary of George Meister land.

Beginning on the South Side of the Geneva hog law District Beginning on P.H. McGowns E. line, Thence South; Thence East along J.W. Fullen N.B. line, Thence North, Thence West to East East side of Hemphill and Geneva Road to Thomas line the same being the line of said hog law district.
