We, the undersigned resident property tax paying voters of Common School District No. 5, in Sabine County, Texas, do desire to tax ourselves for the purpose of supplementing the State School Fund apportioned to said district and we hereby make application to the County Judge of Sabine County, Texas, for an order for an election to be held in said Common School District No. 5, in Sabine County, to determine whether or not a tax of and at the rate of Seventy Five Cents on the \$100.00 valuation of taxable property in said District shall be levied for said purpose.

On this day came on to be considered the returns of an election held on the 16th day of April, 1927, in Common School District No. 3, of Sabine County, upon the question of levying a tax of One Hundred Cents on all taxable property of said District for the purpose of supplementing the State School Fund Apportioned to said District, and it appearing that said election was in all respects legally held, that said returns were duly and legally made and that there were cast at said election 13 votes of which there were cast:

For the increase of Tax, 13 votes,
Against the increase of Tax 0 votes.

And it appearing to the Court from said returns that a majority of the qualified property tax paying voters of said District voting at said election, voting in favor of said tax and authorizing the Commissioners' Court to levy, assess and collect annually a tax of and at the rate of One Hundred Cents on the \$100.00 valuation of taxable property in said District for said purpose. The Court does hereby declare the proposition for the tax to have been adopted.

The proposition to have Finance Ledger in the County Clerk's Office posted up to date of December 31st, 1926, was considered. Mr. R.H. Minton proposed to do the work in 5 or 6 days at the rate of \$10.00 per day. A motion by J.D. Edgar, seconded by E.J. McGown to employ Mr. Minton to do this work at this price and length of time carried, and he is therefore employed with the understanding that the time consumed in posting and balancing this ledger will not, in all probability, exceed 6 days.

The State of Texas,) KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That whereas Robert Grace
County of Sabine,) has this day been duly authorized by the Commissioners' Court of said County to keep up a ferry for the space of one year next ensuing, after the date hereof, at Robertson's Crossing on the Sabine River, in said County, and to charge the rates of ferrage established by said Court for crossing therat.

Now, therefore, we, the said Robert Grace, as principal, A.G.Pratt and C.P.Toole as sureties, acknowledge ourselves bound to pay to the County Judge of said County of Sabine, the sum of \$1000.00, conditioned that the said Robert Grace will at all times keep good and sufficient boats for the use of such ferry, and will also keep the banks on each side of the ferry in good repair, and so graded and leveled that the rise shall not exceed one foot in every 7 feet from the water's edge to the top of the bank, and that said ferry shall be well attended at all times, and that he will comply with all requirements of the law relating to or governing ferries.

The State of Texas,) TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS' COURT, HEMPHILL, SABINE
County of Sabine,) COUNTY, TEXAS:

We the undersigned free holders in precinct No. 1, in said Sabine County, Texas, represent that for the convenience of themselves and of the public generally, they desire a new public road to be opened, beginning in Sabine County, Texas, at a point where the L.H. & G. R.R. Track crosses the public road, or public street, leading from the west side of the public square in the town of Hemphill, Texas, to the Depot in Hemphill, Texas, and running practically direct to the residence of Sam Davidson, and thence easterly and terminating at the intersection of the public road leading from the Speights Bridge on Pologocho Creek, via. the residence of T.G.Speights, Sam Stanley, Nathan Boyett, N.P. Collier, J.S.Goodrich, W.D.McGown & G.W.Alford, and to Hemphill, Texas.

Wherefore premises considered, the undersigned petitioners pray for the appointment of a Jury of View, that the same be opened and established as a public road, this the first day of April, A.D.1927.
