
The Honorable Commissioners' Court met in regular session Monday, June 13th 1927,
at the regular meeting place in the Court House, the following members being presents:

R. H. Dent, County Judge,
E. J. McGowen, Commissioner Precinct #1,
J. A. Hyden, Commissioner Precinct #2,
R. C. Travis, Commissioner Precinct #3
and the following business was had:

Ordered by the Court that Jim Fuller be given permission to order for the County 50
gallons of dip, furnished at \$1.50 per gallon.

That the County Treasurer be authorized and directed to transfer \$72.00 out of Highway
8a to Highway 8b.

That J.H. Letney be granted permission to employ hands and supervise the rebuilding
of the County Dipping Vat at Brookeland, Texas.

The returns of a special election held at Lone Star School House, District No. 5, were
canvassed. It appearing that the election was legally held and that there were cast 26
votes of which number there were cast for the tax 17 votes; against the tax 9 votes.

It appearing that a majority of the votes were cast in favor of the tax the proposition for

Increase of School Tax is declared adopted.

That the Court disapproved action of the County Treasurer in paying off two warrants, one
for \$1000.00, payable to G.W. Swain, and the other for \$2182.49, payable to George & Kerr,
which amount was being held in escrow at the First National Bank, and being covered by filed
claims of persons having furnished materials and labor; said payment having been made without
the warrant, sanction or order of the Court.

That the Sheriff is hereby directed for the second time to open the gates leading
into the inclosure of Mrs. Lee Buckley, Roy Buckley, Peral Conn and Ivy Buckley, and serve
each one with a copy of the Court's order relating to the same.

There being no further business Court was adjourned.
