

The Commissioners' Court re-convened as a Board of Equalization June 20th, 1927, and remained in session up to and including June 27th, 1927, during which time all persons appearing before the Board were heard and adjustments agreed upon.

The Board agreed to accept Temple Lumber Company's Taxes as per approved roll for the year 1925, in lieu of 1926, and payment of said Taxes as of 1925 is unanimously agreed to be the final and conclusive settlement for 1926 Taxes, and the County Clerk is hereby ordered to leave off recording delinquent tax roll of Temple Lumber Company of year 1926.

The Court adjourned as a Board of Equalization on June 27th. at 2:00 o'clock P.M., and convened in Special Session of Commissioners' Court immediately afterwards, all members thereof being present, and transacted the following business, to-wit:

Pending accounts were allowed, and the following orders were had: *New Pro Form*

1st: That there is hereby levied for the year 1927 on all taxable property in Sabine County on the first day of January of the current year on the \$100.00 valuation the following taxes:

An Ad Valorem Tax of and at the rate of .15% on the \$100.00 valuation for the support and maintenance of the Road and Bridge Fund.

And Ad Valorem Tax of and at the rate of .25% for the General County Fund.

An Ad Valorem Tax of and at the rate of .25% for the Permanent Improvement Fund.

An Ad Valorem tax of and at the rate of .10% for the Jury Fund.

An Ad Valorem Tax of and at the rate of .65% for the County Bond Sinking Fund.

An Ad Valorem Tax of and at the rate of \$1.50 on the \$100.00 valuation for the year 1927, for the support and maintenance of Road District No. 1 Sinking Fund; \$1.25 on the \$100.00 valuation for the year 1927, for the support and maintenance of Road District No. 2 Sinking Fund; \$1.30 on the \$100.00 valuation for the year 1927, for the support and maintenance of Road District No. 3 Sinking Fund; \$2.25 on the \$100.00 valuation for the year 1927, for the support and maintenance of Road District No. 4 Sinking Fund; \$2.50 on the \$100.00 valuation for the year 1927, for the support and maintenance of Road District No. 5 Sinking Fund; \$2.00 on the \$100.00 valuation for the year 1927, for the support and maintenance of Road District No. 6 Sinking Fund; \$2.00 on the \$100.00 valuation for the year 1927, for the support and maintenance of Road District No. 7 Sinking Fund; \$1.00 on the \$100.00 valuation for the year 1927, for the support and maintenance of Road District No. 8 Sinking Fund; \$1.50 on the \$100.00 valuation for the year 1927, for the support and

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maintenance of Road No. 9, Sinking Fund; \$1.00 on the \$100.00 valuation for the year 1927, for the support and maintenance of Road District No. 10, Sinking Fund; \$1.25 on the \$100.00 valuation for the year 1927, for the support and maintenance of Road District No. 12 Sinking Fund; \$1.00 on the \$100.00 valuation for the year 1927, for the support and maintenance of Road District No. 13, Sinking Fund.

2nd: That .06% and .02%, respectively, of the .15% Road and Bridge Levy of 1927 be set aside by the County Treasurer to the credit of the Road and Bridge Funding Warrant Funds, or as much thereof as may be necessary to care for maturing warrants and accrued interest for the current year. This means to the credit of Road and Bridge Funding Warrant Funds Class Nos. 2 and 3.

3rd: That .06% and .05%, respectively, of the .25% General County Levy of 1927 be set aside to the credit of the General County Funding Warrant Fund, Class 4, by the County Treasurer, or as much thereof as may be necessary to care for maturing warrants and interest for the current year.

4th: That there is hereby levied a County Occupation Tax for the year 1927, at one half (1/2) of the amount of Occupation Tax levied by the State of Texas, upon all of the occupations as named in Article No. 7047, Civil Statute 1925, and provided further the provisions of this law shall not be deemed to effect the provisions of any law specially authorizing the Commissioners' Court to levy a different rate of tax.

5th: That .02% of the .15% Road and Bridge Levy of 1927 be set aside to the credit of the Bridge Repair Bond Fund by the County Treasurer, or as much thereof as is necessary to care for maturing warrants and accrued interest for the current year.

6th: That .06% of the .25% Permanent Improvement Levy of 1927 be set aside to the credit of the Jail Improvement Warrant Fund by the County Treasurer, or as much thereof as is necessary to care for maturing warrants and accrued interest for the current year.

7th: That there is hereby levied for the year 1927 on all taxable property in Common School Districts Nos. 12, 19, 23, 24, 28 & 29, of this County, on the first day of January of the current year the following taxes: An Ad Valorem Tax of and at the rate of .50% on the \$100.00 valuation in said Districts to supplement the State School Funds apportioned to said Districts for the support and maintenance of Public Schools.

8th: That there is hereby levied for the year 1927 on all taxable property in Common School Districts Nos. 8, 9, 11, 14, 15, 16, 20, 25, 26, 27, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36 & 37 of this County on the first day of January, of the current year, the following taxes: An Ad Valorem tax of and at the rate of .75% on the \$100.00 valuation in said Districts to supplement the State School Funds apportioned to said Districts for the support and maintenance of Public Schools.

9th: That there is hereby levied for the year 1927 on all taxable property in Common School Districts Nos. 3, 4, 6, 17, 30 & 38 of this County on the first day of January, of the current year, the following taxes: An Ad Valorem Tax of and at the rate of \$1.00 on the \$100.00 valuation in said districts to supplement the State School Funds apportioned to said Districts for the support and maintenance of Public Schools.

10th: That there is hereby levied for the year 1927 on all taxable property in Common School Districts Nos. 14, 16, 17, 20 & 31 of this County on the first day of January, of the current year, the following taxes:

(a) An Ad Valorem tax of and at the rate of .40, .43, .45, .52 & .65%, respectively, on the \$100.00 valuation in said Districts for the support and maintenance of Public Schools.

(b) An Ad Valorem tax of and at the rate of .30, .32, .23 & .10% respectively, on the \$100.00 valuation in said Districts to pay current interest on and providing one years Sinking Fund for the bonds of said Districts.



Ordered by the Court that F.S.Morrison be appointed Justice of the Peace, Precinct No.3, and W.A.Byrd be appointed Constable Precinct No.3.

Ordered by the Court that Mrs. Callie Gates be allowed \$20.00 on condemned animal, in addition to the \$5.00 already allowed.

There being no further business the Court adjourned.
