Ordered by the Court that the County Treasurer be authorized to collect from the County Depository, interest on net balances for the year 1927, and place same to the credit of General County Fund.

That distribution of Road and Bridge fund, for the year 1928, be made among the commissioners' beats as follows: Beat No. 1, \$4250.00, Beat No. 2, \$3100.00. Beat No. 3 \$3700.00. Beat No. 4, \$3100.00.

That warrants for the payment of the main guard be made payable to the sheriff.

That the salary of P. S. Goen be raised from \$1000.00 to \$1120.

That T. I. Chambres be appointed Justice of the peace, of precinct No. 3 at Milan.

The following prices be allowed for teams and labor on public roads: For two up teams with frasnoc and one man, \$6.00. For Slip team with driver \$5.00. For ordinary labor \$2.50. These prices effective from and after March 1st, 1928.

That T. J. Bickley be appointed Road Overseer on the road leading from S. E. Hankla to Sexton highway, by way of T. J. Bickleys.

TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF SABINE COUNTY TEXAS:

We, the undersigned persons, owners of the hereinafter described lands with adjoining lands on the east side in which a stock law now prevails and in which hogs, sheep and

goats are not permitted to run at large, hereby petition your Honorable body to include the following lands and territory in said Stock Law territory and that you pass an order extending the stock law forbidding the running of dogs, sheep and goats at large in such territory being described as follows:

Beginning on the public highway leading from Hemphill, to Milam at the S. E. corner of Tom Speights' land; Thence westerly with said Speights' south line to his S. W. corner; Thence northerly with said Speights' west line to the Pologcho creek; Thence up Pologcho creek with its meanders to the N. E. corner of the A. C. Arthur tract of 576 acres; Thence S. 11 deg. 30' E. with said Arthur's E. B. line to the N. E. corner of a tract owned by J. J. Cammack; Thence westerly with said Cammack's north line to his northwest corner; thence southerly with Cammack's W. B. line to his S. W. corner; thence easterly with said Cammack's S. line to his S. E. corner on G. W. Oliphint's W. B. line. Thence in a southerly direction with said G. W. Oliphint's W. B. line to the N. E. line of the H. E. Griffin survey. Thence east with the N. E. line of the H. E. Griffin to its N. E. corner Thence S. 75 W. with Joseph Walker's N. E. line to the N. E. corner of a 32 $\frac{1}{2}$  acre tract owned by M. D. Boyett. Thence S. 45 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. with M. D. Boyett's line to his S. E. corner; Thence S. 75 W. 100 vrs. to S. J. Davidson's N. E. corner; Thence S. with Davidson's east line to his southeast corner; Thence S. 75 W. with Davidson's S. line to the corner of J. W. Minton's 37-7/10 acre tract; Thence N. 1 W. with J. W. Minton's east line to the N. E. corner of his 37-7/10 acre tract; Thence S. 75 W. with J. W. Minton's N. line and the N. line of a 2 acre tract owned by J. F. Davidson, to J. F. Davidson's N. W. corner; Thence S. 11 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. with J. F. Davidson's west line and J. W. Minton's west line of a 37-7/10 acre tract to its westerly corner of said 37-7/100 acre tract; thence S. 7 E. with J. W. Minton's W. B. line to corner on the N. E. line of a 100 acre subdivision of the Walker headright owned by J. W. Minton; Thence S. 75 W. with said Minton's 100 acre tract to its W. W. corner; Thence S. 14 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. with the W. B. line of said J. W. Minton's 100 acre survey to the north corner of J. W. Minton's 27 $\frac{1}{2}$  acre subdivision; Thence S. with the W. B. line of said Minton's 27 $\frac{1}{2}$  acre subdivision to corner of J. H. Minton's 7 $\frac{1}{2}$  acre subdivision on said Walker headright; Thence S. 42 W. with said J. H. Minton's W. B. line 966 feet to the Hemphill and Bronson highway; Thence south 50 $\frac{1}{2}$  feet. to J. T. Carlton's S. W. corner; Thence N. 42 E. with Carlton's west boundary line 417 feet to Carlton's N. W. corner; Thence S. 49 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. on Carlton's north line 206 feet to his N. E. corner; Thence S. 41-3/4 W. with Carlton's west line 414 feet to the Hemphill, and Bronson Highway. thence in a southeasterly direction with said Hemphill and Bronson Highway to the W. B. line of the right-of-way of the L.H. & G. Ry. Co. thence in an easterly direction with the north line of said Right-of-way and land owned by the L.H. & G. Ry. Co. to a corner of same near the Grand Planer; Thence S. with the E. line of said L.H. & G. Tract to the S. W. corner of the G. W. Speights' 2 acre tract, same being the N. W. corner of the town of Hemphill as at present incorporated; Thence N. 74 E. to the W. B. line of G. W. Alford's subdivision; Thence N. with Alford's W. B. line to his N. W. corner; Thence N. 76 E. 107 $\frac{1}{2}$  vrs. to the S. W. corner of the J. O. Toole 52-3/4 acre survey. Thence N. 15 W. with the west line of said Toole 52-3/4 acre tract to its N. W. corner. Thence N. 25 E. with N. Linesaid Toole's 52-5/4 acre tract to its N. E. corner. Thence N. 15 W. with the east line of the A. W.
