

The Commissioners' Court re-convened as a Board of Equalization June 18th, 1928, and remained in session up to and including June 21st, 1928, during which time all persons appearing before the Board were heard and adjustments agreed upon.

The Court adjourned as a Board of Equalization on June 21st, 1928, and immediately convened in Special Session of Commissioners' Court, all members thereof being present and transacted the following business, to-wit:

WHEREAS, Kirby Lumber Company did in the year 1926 fail to pay the taxes on the Bronson town lots, said taxes being delinquent since the year 1926, having refused to pay same on account of what appeared to them to be exorbitant, they now promise to pay said taxes and 6% interest since delinquency, provided the Court will accept same on a basis of 1927 rendition. Wherefore, said adjustment appearing to the Court to be right and proper, it is therefore ordered that the Tax Collector of Sabine County be authorized and directed to collect the taxes on that basis and issue receipt accordingly, upon payment of same.

WHEREAS, for several years past Charles T. Butler, Trustee, has been the owner of 200 acres of the Jesse Low Survey, Abstract No. 148, and 20 acres of the Isaac Low Survey, Abstract No. 35, and

WHEREAS, in assessing said land, it has been assessed as 200 acres on the Isaac Low Survey

Abstract No. 35, and 20 acres on the Jesse Low Survey, Abstract No. 148, and said

WHEREAS, the taxes have been paid by the Charles T. Butler, Trustee, on the assessment made as set out above erroneously, and

WHEREAS, there now appears on the delinquent tax rolls of Sabine County, an apparent delinquency on a portion of said lands on the Jesse Low Survey,

It is therefore ordered that the Tax Collector of Sabine County, correct his Rolls so as to show the true facts that taxes have been properly paid, and that he be authorized to issue his Certificate to the effect that there are no delinquent taxes due against the 20 acres of the Isaac Low, Abstract No. 35, and the 200 acres of the Jesse Low, Abstract No. 148, owned by Charles T. Butler, Trustee.

There being no further business, court adjourned.

TO THE HON. R. H. DENT,
COUNTY JUDGE, SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS.

We, your petitioners, property tax paying citizens, who are residents of the herein described corporate limits of the town of Hemphill, Texas, which was incorporated for municipal purposes, as a town of more than six hundred population, on the date of October 10th, 1927, each of whom are qualified voters within the incorporate limits of the city of Hemphill, respectfully pray your honor that there be an election ordered within the boundaries of said corporation to abolish the corporation of the city of Hemphill, Texas. The boundaries of said corporation being as follows, to-wit:

"BEGINNING at a point on the E. bank of the Cooper Branch at the S.W. corner of a 36-8/10 acres survey owned by Mrs. L. M. Knox. Thence in a Northerly direction with the meanders of said Cooper branch to where said branch crosses the street leading from Hemphill to E. Mayfield; at the N.W. corner of the E. M. Cousins tract. Thence east with the south margin of right of way of said street from Hemphill to E. Mayfield to where same intersects the W.B. line of the town of Hemphill. Thence north with the W.B. line of the town of Hemphill to the most southerly corner of the A. D. Hamilton tract in said W.B. line of said town of Hemphill. Thence in 60 W. along with Hamilton's line 140 vrs to corner in east margin of Hemphill-Bronson highway. Thence N. 53 E. 25 vrs. to corner. Thence N. 6-1/4 W. along Hamilton's W.B. line 240 vrs to corner in the S.B. line of the E. W. Clark 11-1/5 acre tract. Thence in an easterly direction along said E. W. Clark S.B. line to his S.E. corner. Thence northerly with the E.B. line of said E. W. Clark tract to his N.E. corner, same being the N. W. corner of the A. D. Hamilton land. Thence N. 71 E. 407 vrs with the N.B. line of said Hamilton tract to the N.E. corner of said Hamilton tract. Thence N. 134-1/2 vrs to corner, same being S.E. corner of the Hamilton & Minton 4 acre tract. Thence S. 74-1/4 W. 229 vrs to S.W. corner of said Hamilton & Minton 4 acre tract. Thence N. 115 vrs to the N.W. corner of said 4 acre tract. Thence in a N.E. direction with the N.B. line of said 4 acre tract to the point where said line intersects the S.B. _____ of the right of way of the L. H. & G. Ry. Co. Thence N. to the S.W. corner of a 2 acre block known as the G. W. Speights 2 acre tract. Thence N. 74 E. with the S.E. corner at 122 vrs stake for corner in W.B. line of the G. W. Alford 7 acre tract. Thence N. with Alford's W.B. line to his N.W. corner. Thence N. 76 E. 1064 vrs to the S.W. corner of the J. O. Toole 52-3/4 acre survey, continue same course along Toole's S.B. line to a point in said line where the east edge of the Hemphill-Milam Highway crosses said line. Thence with the east margin of right of way of said Hemphill-

Milam highway to its intersection of said road with the highway leading from Hemphill to Sabinetown. Thence south with a subdivision out of said Joseph Walker survey owned by Mrs. L.M.Knox, to the S.B.line of said Joseph Walker survey. Thence west with the S.B line of said Joseph Walker survey to a point where said line intersects the N.B.line of the Jno. Hailey Survey. Thence in a N.E.direction with the N.B.line of said Haileysurvey to its N.W.corner. Thence continuing same course along the S.B.line of said 36-8/10 acre tract owned by Mrs.L.M.Knox, to the place of beginning.
