The following business was transacted.

On this day came on to be considered the returns of the general election held on Tuesday November 6th, 1928, in Sabine County, and it appearing that said Election was in all respects legally held, and that said returns were duly and legally made and that there were case at said election, in voting precincts, No. 1, to 17, inclusive, for each State, District County and Precinct Candidates, th following number of votes, to-wit:

For State and County Nominees, No. of votes ranging in numbers, from 1165 to 1185, and votes of Precinct nominees in proportion.

For Associate Justice of the Court of Civil Appeals, 9th Jud. District, Daniel Walker. For State Senator, 3rd, district W. E. Thomason. For Representative 41st District; S. R. Williams, For Judge First Judicial District W. C. Ramsey, For District Attorney, 1st, Judicial District, Roi Blak2. For Sheriff. E. B. Smith. For District Clerk. George W. 
Each of the four amendments to the Constitution carried by a small majority.

That the Sheriff, be allowed \$1.50 for the delivering 16 election boxes.

That matter in regard to the Janitor was brought up. Mr. W. D. Powell, refused to include care of hedges for \$50.00 per month, and agreed to resign, which resignation was accepted. The bids of Mr. Brumfield, and W. G. Patterson, were taken up, and on motion of E. J. McDown, 2nd, by J. D. Edgar, the bid of Mr. W. G. Patterson at \$50.00 per month was accepted. His duties are to include complete care of yard, courthouse and jail. Beginning the 16th inst. There being no further business court adjourned.
