and transacted the following business, to-wit:

The returns of a special election held in Plainview common School District No. 31, were canvassed by the Court with results declared to be as follows: For the issuance of bond and levying a tax for the payment thereof, 22 votes; Against the issuance of bonds and levying of tax for the payment thereof, 0 votes: Therefore the proposition to issue bonds and levy tax therefor is adopted.

The Following petitions were presented to the court:

RESOLUTION PLACING COUNTY HIGHWAY FUNDS IN ESCROW:

Whereas, it is proposed to enter into a certain project agreement between the State Highway Department of Texas, and the County of Sabine, for the construction of that certain road described therein, and known and designated therein, and known and designated as State Aid Project No. Job. M-11- Federal Aid Project No. ****, located in Sabine County, Texas at an approved estimated cost of \$3600.00, of which \$1800.00, in State aid has been set aside in the State Treasury and \$-----, in Federal aid set aside in the United State Treasury, and

Whereas, It is required that a satisfactory showing of funds be made before an agreement be entered into; and

Whereas, the said Project agreement provides that the county funds approved and set aside to the credit of said project shall be paid on monthly estimates as the construction work progresses, in accordance with the plans and specifications approved therefor; and

Whereas, the said Project agreement will not be entered into unless the completion of said project in accordance with said plans and specifications can be assured and guaranteed and there is made available, to be used exclusively for the purposes of completing said project the sum of \$1800.00 of which together with the aid approved and set aside therefor, it is estimated will provide sufficient funds for the completion of said project.

Now, therefore, be it resolved, by the Commissioners' Court of said Sabine County, Texas, that the sum of \$1800.00, available from the funds of said County is hereby appropriated and set aside, and will be placed in escrow in the ----- the legally (or a special ly) designated depository for said County, to be used exclusively in paying for work performed in completing the construction of said Maintenance Job M-11- Federal Aid Project No. --- and to be disbursed therefor by the said -----, only in amounts released by the State Highway Engineer of Texas, or his authorized agent, on vouchers submitted by the State Highway Department covering the work done within the period covered by the Statement when duly approved by the State Highway Engineer of Texas, or his authorized agent.

This escrow fund is secured to the County by the aforesaid depository in the sum of \$1800.00) in the following manner. -----

This petition taken under consideration and efforts will be put forth at an early date to construct the accommodation desired.

A petition by M. L. Howare, et al, was presented to the Court, asking for a franchise for erecting light poles wires etc. over, under, upon, across, and along any and all the present and future public roads, highways, streets, squares, parts etc. owned or controlled by Sabine County.

Said Petition was refused.

The following orders were had by the Court:

Ordered by the Court that S. H. Hall, be authorized to appoint C. B. Young deputy Sheriff.

That J. O. Toole, be reimbursed the amount of County Taxes, paid on First National Bank Stock, from the years 1908, to 1914 inclusive, for the reason that the said taxes were also paid by the First National Bank, of Hemphill, Texas, which constituted a double assessment, The amount being \$95.88 and are to be figured on a pro-ratta basis of the assessment of 1927.

That the universal Disinfectant Company's Claim of \$334.34 be allowed in half, the same being \$167.22. The balance to be paid about May 1st, 1928.

No further business at this time Court adjourned till Friday the 14th, 1928.
