
The Commissioners' Court, in and for Sabine County, Texas, met in regular session, Monday and Tuesday, February 11th, and 12th, 1929, with all members, present, to-wit: R. H. Dent, County Judge, E. J. McGown, Commissioner, Precinct No. 1, J. A. Hyden, Commissioner, Precinct No. 2, J. D. Edgar, Commissioner, Precinct No. 3, and J. E. Minton, Commissioner, Precinct No. 4, and Mrs. Berta Harper, County Clerk, and transacted the following business:

Be it ordered by the Court that Delinquent Tax agents R. H. Minton & Zed Bridges proceed at once to prepare and file suit for the collection of Delinquent taxes due by Mrs. L. M. Knox

That the order made at January regular term 1929, appointing R. O. Mott, Justice of the Peace of Precinct #3, be rescinded and that appointments hereafter made to fill vacancies of this kind, be made only upon petition of a substantial number of representative citizenship

That the county Treasurer be directed to take up \$10,000 road district bonds of Road District No. 10, at 9% and interest from J. R. Phillips Inc. Co.

That the partition of road from Six Mile bridge on the Newton road to the Ed McNaughten place about 5 miles length be discontinued.

That W. A. Burkhalter be exempt from road duty upon Disability certificate from Co. Health Officer..

That the bid of First National Bank for County Depository for years 1929 - 30 be accepted. The Bid being as follows:

The Bid of the First National Bank Hemphill, Texas, to act as County Depository, for years 1929: 1930:

Gentlemen:

We submit the following bid in accordance with House Bill Number 120, of the Forty First Legislature, of the State of Texas, for the handling of the funds of Sabine County, for the next two years.

We will pay three (3%) per cent interest per annum on average daily balances of Sabine County, all funds belonging to said County included, said daily balance to be arrived at by allowing us a daily average credit for County warrants carried by us.

We will pay all school warrants of the County against the State and County warrants, of the County against the State and County Apportionment, that is an amount of school warrants equal to the amount of money appropriated by the State and by the County to the State and County available School Fund, all subject however, to the County keeping with us during the life of this Contract, if accepted, the Permanent School Fund of Sabine County, Texas.
