

The Commissioners Court in and for Sabine County, Texas, met in special session February 16th, 1929, at the regular meeting place thereof, in the County House, with all members, being present to wit: R. H. Dent, County Judge, E. J. Mc'own, Comm. Prec. No. 1, J. A. Hyden, Commissioner Prec. No. 2, J. D. Edgar, Comm. Prec. No. 3, and J. E. Minton, Comm. Prec. No. 4, and Mrs. Berta Harper, County Clerk, Sabine Co., Texas, and transacted the following business.

On this day came on to be heard this 4th day of February 1929, the application of L. H. Romig, Agent and attorney in fact for Mary A. Best, a stockholder of the defunct Ogeen Land & Oil Company, owners of 800 acres in Jesse Lowe survey, Abstract 148, for a reduction in the assessed valuation of said land for the years 1921, 1926, 1927, and 1928.

It appearing to the court that the assessed value of said property for the years 1922, 1923 and 1924 was \$4000, \$4400, and \$4400, respectively, by reason of the fact that the timber from said land had been sold during the year 1920, to J. G. Barker, and the taxes on said timber have been regularly paid by Temple Lumber Company for the years 1921, to 1928, both inclusive.

It is therefore ordered that the assessed valuation on said land be reduced to \$4400 for the years 1921, 1926, 1927, and 1928, and the taxes calculated for said years accordingly, the revised amounts due for said years to be as follows, plus penalty and interest in accordance with the statutes:

1926	Original Tax	169.40
1927	Original Tax	168.08
1928	Original Tax	141.36

It is further ordered by the Court that the bond of First National Bank, of Hemphill, as surety depository, be approved.

There being no further business, Court adjourned.
