

The Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas, met in regular session, Monday August 12, 1929, with all members, present, to-wit: R. H. Dent, County Judge, E. J. McGown, Comm. # 1, J. A. Hyden, Comm. # 2, J. D. Edgar, Comm. Prect. No. 3, and J. E. Minton, Comm. Prect. No. 4, E. B. Smith, Sheriff, and Mrs. Berta Harper, Clerk, and transacted the following business:

Be it ordered by the Court that the County treasurers report for the month be approved, Accounts were allowed as per account ledger.

A motion was made by J. D. Edgar, that County Attorney, E. P. Padgett, proceed at once to file suit for the collection of all delinquent taxes, accruing during the year 1928, the motion was second by J. A. Hyden, and duly passed therefor.

Be it ordered by the Court that the County Attorney E. P. Padgett, proceed at once to file and prosecute suits for the collection of all state and county delinquent taxes accruing during the year 1928.

It is ordered by the court that the following notice be published in the Hemphill reporter, four times.

"The Commissioner's Court of Sabine County, Texas, will receive bids up to 10 O'clock A. M. the 9th day of September, in the office of the County Judge, for one Crawler Type tractor. Bids must be accompanied by Cashiers Check to Cover 5% of bid, The Court reserving the right to reject any and all bids.

It is also ordered by the Court that the petition of Hoyett Ricey for 11 acres of land to be annexed to hog law territory be granted:

Petition being as follows:


" TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONER'S COURT SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS:

I, the undersigned owner of the hereinafter described lands, which adjoin lands in which a stock law prevails, and in which hogs, sheep, and goats are not permitted to run at large, hereby petition your honorable body to include the following lands and territory in said stock law territory and that you pass an order extending the stock law forbidding the running at large for hogs, sheep, and goats in such territory, said territory being described as follows: Beginning at the N. E. corner of a five acre tract out of the Ben Franklin per-empt- tion survey heretofore conveyed to B. N. Ener, on the S. B. line of the Joseph Walker survey, a black jack 8 ins. brs. S. 2 1/2 E. 9 ft. a black jack 8 ins. brs. S. 72 1/2 W. 3 ft. Thence N. 75 E. with the S. B. line of the Joseph Walker survey 152 feet to stake in South margin of the Hemphill Fairdale road. Thence S. 67 1/2 E. with said road 60 ft. to stake on South margin of said road, a post oak 18 ins. brs. S. 49 1/2 W. 69 ft. Thence S. 28 1/2 E. 852 feet to a stake set on the S. B. line of the Ben Franklin survey, a post oak 10 ins. brs. N. 42 E. 9 ft. Thence S. 89 1/2 W. with the S. B. line of the said Ben Franklin survey 440 feet to stake set on east margin of road leading to B. C. Arthur's a black jack 4 ins. brs. S. 48 1/2 W. 16 1/2 feet a black jack 5 ins. brs. N. 43 1/2 E. 12 feet. Thence with east margin of said road N. 27 1/2 W. 500. N. 34 1/2 W. 540 feet, to the place of beginning, containing eleven and two tenths acres of land.
