

The Honorable Commissioner's Court in and for Sabine County, Texas, met in special Session August 26th and 29th, 1929 and passed the following orders, to-wit:

Motioned by J. D. Edgar, second by J. A. Hyden, that J. R. Bogard, be employed as special Attorney to represent the County in the case of Brown Crummer Company, Vs. Sabine County, being brought in the United States District Court, of Beaumont, Texas, it is agreed that \$250.00, be and is hereby advanced to him out of the General County Fund and that he be paid \$500.00, more when the suit is over, conditioned that he at his own expense employ one or more of the leading, most efficient, counsel, according to general reputation and experience, in Beaumont, to aid in the County's defense in said suit. Ordered further that the Four County Funds, viz: General County, Road and Bridge, Jury, P. I. and County Bond Fund, bear this expense proportional to their respective rate at the time of issuance of script.

It is ordered by the court that The First National Bank, County Depository, be authorized to convey \$3500.00 in script against the Permanent Improvement Fund and that 5% interest be allowed for the time said script is carried.

It is also ordered by the court that A. J. Willis, be refunded \$7.37, out of funds as follows, proportional to the current rate on each. Road and bridge, General County, P. I. County Bond and Jury, the same being for double tax or for improperly receipted records.

There being no further business, court adjourned.
